"One of the themes in the Scriptures associated with the liturgy over these last few weeks of the Church year is **urgency**. The early Church had a sense of urgency in its need to respond to the Gospel because of their sense that the Lord's coming was imminent.

However, with the passing of time and the growing sense that that coming in glory was not just around the corner the sense of urgency diminished and was, and still is, often replaced by a spirit of complacency.

Perhaps one way to recover that sense of urgency in our response to the Gospel's call is to re-think, re-imagine, what's meant by the Lord's coming. If we consider that the Lord comes into our lives on a daily, even hourly, basis in the people and the events of our lives then there is always an urgency in our need to consider what the Gospel is asking of us.

A sense of urgency or of complacency. An alertness to the Lord's presence in the everyday, or an indifference to it. Those are the questions and the challenges of these last days of our liturgical year.

HOW TO ATTEND MASS

WE HAVE A COVID SAFETY PLAN

- We adhere to maximum number of person permitted in the church based on the four square metre rule
- Green ticks on the seats indicating seating positions ensure maximum separation
- ♦ All are asked to sanitise their hands on entering & leaving We ask all who attend to wear a face mask
- ♦ The pews etc are sanitised after every Mass
- There is no congregational singing and no physical exchange of the sign of peace.
- All are asked to maintain 2 metre spacing when coming forward for Holy Communion (which is given on the hand only and not on the tongue).

CONFLICTING VOICES

We are drowning in a sea of voices.

Superficially, we see this in advertising. Everywhere around us, billboards, radio, television, newspapers, magazines, the internet, and the fashion industry, hold out the promise of something better for us—a new soap, a new lover, a new philosophy of life..

More deeply, however, we experience this sea of voices as a great tension. The different voices we hear pull us in many directions and, after a while, we're no longer sure who we are, what we believe in, or what will bring us life. Different voices tell us different things and each voice seems to carry its own truth.

On the one hand, there's a powerful voice beckoning us towards self-sacrifice, self-renunciation, altruism, heroism, telling us that happiness lies in giving life away, that selfishness will make us unhappy, and that we will only be ourselves when we are big-hearted, generous, and put the needs of others before our own. Deep down, we all know the truth of that, it's Jesus' voice telling us that there is no greater love, nor meaning, than to lay down one's life for others. Francis of Assisi was right, we only receive by giving. And so we admire people who radiate that and we feed our souls and those of our children with stories of heroism, selflessness, and bigness-of-heart.

But that's not the only voice we hear. We hear as well a powerful, persistent voice seemingly calling us in the opposite direction. Superficially, this is the voice calling us towards pleasure, comfort, and security, the voice that tells us to take care of ourselves, to drink in life's pleasures to the full, to seize the day while it's still ours to have.

More deeply, this is the voice that challenges us not to be too timid or fearful to be a full human being. This voice invites us to participate in, contribute to, and enjoy the wonderful energy, colour, wit, intelligence, and creativity that makes the world go round and makes life worth living. This is the voice beckoning us towards romance, creativity, art, sex, achievement, physical health, the voice telling us Jesus' parable of the talents and holding before us a truth too often neglected in religious circles, namely, that God is also the author of eros, colour, physical health, wit, and intelligence. Life, it insists, needs to be tasted, in God's name.

So which is the real voice? Is one of these voices to be heeded and the other resisted?

This is a complex question and there's more to it than meets the eye. Historically, the temptation, at least in

religious circles, has been to over-simplistically identify the voice of Jesus with the voice that calls us toward selfsacrifice and asceticism: "Everything is about selfrenunciation!" Indeed, it is. Jesus did say that, as did every great saint.

But Jesus and those others also said more, and our failure to take heed of the rest of what they said has sometimes made for a spirituality that is a half-truth with some nasty consequences, namely, in the name of religion, we have sometimes become unhealthily fearful, timid, and guilt-ridden. Whenever this happens, the other voice, the one inviting us to enter more fully into life's dance of energy, is not blotted out but driven underground and there, because we have neglected part of what God has called us to, instead of becoming martyrs, we become people with "martyr-complexes," frustrated persons whose energies become negative and manipulative in the name of love and service.

Moreover, in the name of this half-truth, we often end up having God fighting God, truth fighting truth, wisdom fighting energy, and spiritual health fighting physical health, because we've put self-renunciation in false opposition to the challenge to also enter into the wonderful God-given energy of this planet where beauty, romance, creativity, physical health, wit, wine-drinking, and good humour also extend part of God's authentic invitation.

How to find a balance in all of this? If both voices invite us to truth and yet they seem in opposition to each other, where do we go with this?

There is no simple truth, here or anywhere else. Truth is painfully complex (as are we) and truth is always bigger than our capacity to absorb and integrate it. To be open to truth is to be perpetually stretched and perpetually in tension, at least this side of eternity. And that's true in terms of the seeming opposition between these voices. At times they are in real opposition and we can't have it both ways, but have to choose one to the detriment of the other.

Truth has real boundaries and there's a danger in letting it mean everything. But there's an equal danger in letting it mean too little, of reducing a full truth to a half-truth—and nowhere, at least in the spiritual life, is this danger greater than in our tendency to let either of these voices completely blot out the other.

Notes to the Finance Report for the Year Ended 30 June 2020

- 1. Fr Colin and Fr Thomas together with the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Committee thank parishioners for your wonderful support in the continuing work of the Parish & their contributions to the collections. Our results for 2019/20 show a surplus in operating activities. After utilising funds from prior years & servicing our loan & expenditure on capital projects this resulted in a negative cash flow of \$45,000. This expenditure was planned for in 2018/19.
- 2. The accounts do not include the First Collection and external collections e.g. CWF, Catholic Mission. These collections are remitted direct to the relevant body. The accounts only include monies received for the second collections, either from planned giving, envelopes or cash on the weekly plate. <u>Total second collections have decreased 9% from the prior year</u>. This is predominantly due to the COVID restrictions during 2020 which resulted in the closure of the physical Church for a number of months from March 2020.
- 3. In 2018/19 the Parish identified and commenced urgent repairs & maintenance on the presbytery in Lindfield, primarily financed by parishioner donations. In March 2020 the parish entered into a loan facility for \$75,000 for stage 2 of these repairs, which included guttering, drainage, driveway & electrical work. \$56,000 had been drawn down by end of June.
- 4. There were no requests for Donations in 2019/20 for specific projects. However, the Parish was very fortunate to receive donations towards office equipment and costs incurred in the transition to remote working.
- 5. The net income for Sacramental Programmes comes from the contribution charged to participating families. The employment costs of our Sacramental Co-ordinator and Assistant Co-ordinator (which are taken from this income) are recorded as part of employment costs. Sacramental Income fluctuates annually depending on the timing of the Sacraments and the number of children making their Sacraments. The fees for sacramental programmes were waived during online preparations.
- 6. The Festival of Christmas fund raising activities did not occur in 2019.
- 7. The \$11,028 non-specific donations include \$4,440 donated for flowers, \$1,000 donated for printing and the balance of \$5,588 from general donations.
- 8. The Parish Rooms rental income is received from hiring out Mackillop Hall, St Brigid's Hall and the Parish meeting room. The demand for hiring these premises continued at the same level as requested in 2018/2019 until COVID required the facilities to be closed from March 2020. This resulted in a reduction in rental income of \$8,000. There were \$5,872 of rental expenses incurred for repairs and maintenance, operating costs and utilities for MacKillop Hall these expenses are included in 'Repairs and Maintenance' (see Note 10).
- 9. Other income of \$8,000 includes income received from advertisements in our newsletter (\$4,018), and the balance from candle, CCD and piety stall sales.
- 10. Repairs and maintenance costs of \$55,000 includes \$5,872 of rental expenses related to MacKillop Hall, St Brigid's Hall and the Parish meeting room. In addition to the \$18,868 spent on repairs and maintenance at both churches, the \$55,000 includes \$8,901 on gardening/grounds maintenance and \$15,470 on cleaning across both locations.
- 11. Administration costs have decreased \$9k due to a re-allocation of costs incurred for the Office Manager (\$2.6k to Employment costs) and \$5k reduction in utilities costs due to installation of solar panels & decreased usage due to Covid.
- 12. Employment costs have decreased 2% from 2018/19 to 2019/20.
- 13. Pastoral costs have decreased in 2020 due to the restrictions on church activities from March 2020 due to COVID 19.

FACE MASKS

For the good of public health we'd like to ask that you wear a face mask at Mass if at all possible. We have disposable masks available near the doors, though as keeping up that supply comes at a cost it would be helpful if you could provide your own mask.

Face masks are not recommended for young children.

A few practical points:

- Please take used masks home for disposal as it's not possible for us to safely handle a multitude of used masks in the bins.
- to ensure they're effective please make sure they cover the nostrils as well as the mouth
- when coming forward to receive Holy Communion please keep the mask on as you receive the Host; then step 1.5 metres to the side before lowering the mask to place the Host in your mouth. Many thanks.


