Today we enter Jerusalem with Jesus and so enter into Holy Week, the holiest week in our calendar. As we reflect on the Passion of Jesus today's liturgy calls us to set this week aside as no other week. We do not prepare for Easter holidays – we prepare for the Easter holy days.

We enter into the most wonderful week of our year, a week with liturgy rich in its symbolism and its power to touch our hearts and give life to our spirits. But it's up to us whether we give the Easter liturgy the chance to do that to us, and within us.

Let's enter together into the entirety of the Easter Triduum, from the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, through the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday morning and the Solemn Liturgy in the afternoon, and climaxing in the celebration of the Mass of the Easter Vigil and the joyful celebration of the resurrection at 7:30pm on Holy Saturday evening.

The days of the life-giving death and resurrection of Jesus are fast approaching. Let's enter into them and be renewed as individuals and as a parish.

From there we will process with our palms to the church while our brothers and sisters from Lindfield Uniting Church will then set forth to walk up the highway to their church on the corner of Provincial Road. THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION AND LENT

Please note that, as advised in the bulletin over the last five weeks, there are now **NO** further times for Reconciliation before Easter (including no Reconciliation next Saturday – Holy Saturday ~ afternoon).

As we prepare for Easter.....we need your help....

There are a several simple ways you could help us to celebrate the great feast of Easter:

- A holy forest: on Holy Thursday night we again want to create a beautiful 'Garden of Gethsemane' at the Altar of Repose at Killara. To do that could we ask you to do some garden trimming and drop us off your offcuts – they can include plenty of large leafy branches up to 2 metres tall, palm fronds etc. We also need a loan of large pot plants if that's possible. If you can help please drop your foliage off to St Joseph's Hall at Killara - either on the Wednesday night of Holy Week, or on Holy Thursday morning before 11am.
- ◆ Setting up: then we need <u>helpers</u> to set up the Garden of Gethsemane–at 11am at Killara on Holy Thursday.
- Easter Flowers: at Easter the parish pays for the flowers since there are a much larger quantity needed. If you would like to help by making a donation towards the cost of the Easter flowers please contact the Parish Office.
- Easter Party: and finally there will again be an 'Easter Party' following the Easter Vigil. If you can, please bring a plate and drop it off before the Easter Vigil begins.

CHRISM MASS This coming Tuesday 4th April Bishop Anthony Randazzo, joined by all the priests and deacons of the diocese, will celebrate the Chrism Mass at our Cathedral at Waitara (23 Yardley Ave) at 7:30pm. At this Mass the Oils of Catechumens and of the Sick will be blessed and the Chrism will be consecrated—the oils which we will receive into our parish on Holy Thursday night for the celebration of the sacraments over the next year.

The priests of the diocese also renew their commitment to ministry.

Please try to be there— a special celebration which brings together the bishop, priests, deacons and all the members of the Church of Broken Bay.

TOO HOT? TOO COLD?

With its uninsulated roof our church at Killara can be very hot in summer and very cold in winter. A family in our parish is willing to make a very generous contribution (~\$30,000) towards heating & cooling the church with air conditioning - but the donation is dependent on us raising the remaining funds from further parishioner donations (a further ~\$30,000, towards which we have so far received pledges of \$11,000. In the interests of economy & the environment we would set aside funds from the Killara development income over the next few years so as to subsequently install solar power.

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FR RICHARD ROHR OFM'S MEDITATION . . . ADMITTING OUR POWERLESSNESS

Father Richard has long admired what he considers the "spiritual genius" of Bill Wilson (1895–1971), one of the founders of Alcoholics Anonymous. In his book on the spirituality of the Twelve Steps, Richard describes why the beyond comfort. first step is essential—for alcoholics & non-alcoholics alike:

Until and unless there is a person, situation, event, idea, conflict, or relationship that we cannot "manage," we'll never find the True Manager. So, God makes sure that several things will come our way that we cannot manage on our own. Self-made people, & all heroic spiritualities, will try to manufacture an even stronger self by willpower the unbending, sometimes proud, & eventually rigid personality that will be the long-term result.

It is the imperial ego that has to go, and only powerlessness May again and again we be awed by Your presence. That can do the job correctly. Otherwise, we try to engineer our therefore, by power—which is definition, transformation! It seems we can in no way engineer or cannot reach. steer our own conversion. If we try to change our ego with the help of our ego, we only have a better-disguised ego! To borrow a quote often associated with Albert Einstein, "No problem can be solved from the same level of consciousness that created it." [1]

Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie offer this prayer which [2] Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie, Good Enough: 40ish Devotionals for a Life of speaks to those times when life seems unmanageable:

A Prayer for When God Seems Absent

Oh God, comfortable would we be if You gave us formulas and answered prayers and realised hope. But You call us

As we prepare for the great celebrations of Easter . . .

FASTING... A reminder that Good Friday is a day of fast and of abstinence from meat. Holy Saturday, as the solemn day of prayerful *waiting* for the resurrection, is the day of the even more solemn Paschal Fast.

AND FEASTING! ... Following the Easter Vigil everyone is once again invited to stay on and share beer, wine, tea, coffee and supper together. All drinks will be provided. Please bring a plate of food if you are able (which can be dropped off to St Brigid's Hall above Holy Family church before the Easter Vigil).

AND ABOVE ALL... please be part of the celebration of the *entire* Easter Triduum. Easter is too great a feast to be confined to one day – the richness and beauty of the Easter liturgy is spread over three days, from the gentle Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday night, through the prayerful meditation of the Good Friday celebrations, and culminating in the sheer joy and beauty of the great Mass of the Easter Vigil at 7:30pm on Holy Saturday night. What's in a name?

Hopefully we as Christians can at least be permitted to name our own holy days?!

Despite the illiteracy of Coles, Woolies and the rest of the retail industry:


- ♦ this coming Thursday is **Holy** Thursday, not Easter Thursday
- this coming Friday is **Good** Friday, not Easter Friday
- this coming Saturday is Holy Saturday, not Easter Saturday

Why is that important?

Firstly, because the stark barrenness of Holy Saturday speaks of a world *without Easter*: what might have been. Our churches are stripped, stark and bare. It is not yet Easter!

And secondly - because every day of the week following Easter Sunday is preceded by the word 'Easter': 'Easter Sunday', then 'Easter Monday', 'Easter Tuesday'...all the way up to 'Easter Saturday' (the Saturday after Easter Sunday!). That week is the Easter Octave, a week of the overflowing joy of the Resurrection which spills into the rest of the 50 days of the Easter Season. We cant peak too early! As in life, so in liturgy, the Resurrection only comes through the way of the Cross. Fr Colin




Some important reminders for this Holy Week:
