'What I say in the dark proclaim from the rooftops...whoever disowns me in the presence of people I will disown..." This week's Gospel is about having the courage ('Do not be afraid' are Jesus' opening words) to admit that we're disciples of Jesus.

Sometimes we have to do that by words, but even more often by the even more courageous act of letting people *see* that our faith means something to us, that it *shapes* us:

- ♦ for instance by being *seen* as a person who *prays*
- or by being seen as a person who loves and draws life from the Eucharist
- or by being *heard* when we challenge injustices or prejudice or judgementalism

We can disown Jesus in more subtle ways than by denying him outright – which we're not likely to do.

We can more easily do it by our *in*action than our action. By our *silence* rather than our words.

By not allowing our faith to be seen.

And thereby by not allowing God's place in our hearts and our lives to be seen.

Would you like to join in an online time of prayer?

I'd like to offer an opportunity for just a short time of prayer each week.

In the Church's tradition of the daily 'Prayer of the Hours' the late afternoon/early evening is time for the prayer of 'Vespers' - a time praise and intercession as the day draws to an end.

If you'd like to take **just fifteen minutes** at this time to join me in this prayer online please go the special page of our website ('Parish Life in the Current Situation') and scroll down to the Resource at the very bottom entitled 'Weekly Vespers' and click on it **ON WEDNESDAYS** at 4:55pm to be ready for the prayer time which will begin at 5:00pm and conclude by 5:15pm. The texts needed for the time of prayer will appear on the screen.

The return of Sunday Mass! Sunday Mass has returned—though public health restrictions mean that a maximum of 50 people may attend a Mass and so Fr Thomas and I have now introduced a weekend Mass schedule of ten Masses each weekend so that all may come to share in the celebration of the Eucharist. We will also continue with the online Mass for those who cannot come to a physical celebration at this stage.

We will review this timetable after this current weekend depending on Mass attendance.

So that we may comply with public health restrictions it is essential **to make a booking** to attend Mass each week – however this is very simple, taking only a few seconds. You can book up to 30 minutes before each Mass. Either go to the special hotlink box on the homepage of our parish website (www.lindfieldkillara.org.au) or click on this link: https://www.bbcatholic.org.au/lindfield-killara/mass-and-prayer-times/the-return-of-sunday-and-weekday-mass-with-50-people

If you or someone you know is not comfortable with online bookings just call Philita in the Parish Office (Tues. – Fri. 9:30am-4:00pm) and she will do it for you. You can book to come every week—there's no restriction at all on how often you can book to come to Mass.

Your health and safety We have made every provision to ensure that our gatherings are safe:

- the pews and other hard surfaces will be sanitised after every Mass
- we have also placed signs on the pews with a green tick like this: ü Please sit **DIRECTLY ON THE SIGN** (they'll be sanitised as well!), not just anywhere on the pew. We have placed them to obtain maximum physical separation. Immediate family may of course sit together but everyone else must sit on a separate tick sign.
- Please use the hand sanitiser at the doors when entering and leaving the church.
- Holy Communion will not be given on the tongue but on the hand only.
- ~ For health and safety we won't pass round the collection bowls however there will be two boxes clearly labelled **FIRST COLLECTION AND SECOND COLLECTION** in a prominent position in the centre of each church. We hope that after the long period of church closure you can resume your weekly giving. There are also Tap and Go machines in Lindfield church and the homepage of our website gives details about online giving.
- The churches will be locked once Mass begins so please be on time—we are obliged to have an accurate record of who is in attendance and we must ensure that we don't exceed the maximum number permitted..

If you – or anyone at home in your household – has even the mildest sign of a cold or other respiratory infection **PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND MASS**.

For those who have health concerns We will have weekday Mass each day from Monday - Saturday at 10am (with up to 50 people) in one or other of our churches (see the bulletin for details – bookings also need to be made for weekday Mass). We will also have a Mass at 12 noon on Tuesday at our Killara church for 10 people only – this is reserved for those over 70 or who have an underlying health condition.

In addition, we can accommodate a few people who need a greater physical distancing in the choir loft at Lindfield for Sunday or weekday Mass. This cannot be booked online – please contact the Parish Office if you wish to arrange to be seated in the choir loft.

Looking forward to seeing you Our governments are looking forward to re-starting the economy. It falls to all of us to 're-start the Church'. We have been separated from one another physically for all too long – let's all play our part now in coming together as a community to celebrate the awesome, precious gift of the Eucharist. We can't wait to see you! *Fr Colin*

PLEASE IGNORE the earlier instruction regarding booking to attend Mass where it was stated that you could only book once until everyone had had a turn. THE PARISH OFFICE is continuing to operate (Tues.—Fri.), though only one staff member is there at a time—the rest of the staff are working from home. For public health it's not possible to visit the office so please make contact by phone or email and the staff will assist you.



A LITTLE NOTE ABOUT THE CHANGES TO RESTRICTIONS COMING ON 1ST JULY

As you're no doubt aware from 1st July the NSW Government will be increasing the numbers who can attend church and funerals. However the caveat is that the requirement that there must be four square metres of space per person must still be observed.

Unfortunately this means there will be no increase to the permissible numbers for our two churches as the 4m² requirement means that our Killara church will still be limited to 50 people and our Lindfield church will still be limited to 45 people—both for Masses in general and for funerals.

WE'RE REALLY TRYING ~ BUT WE NEED YOUR HELP TOO

As part of our need to help public safety we need welcomers for each of the ten weekend Masses we're having as we are obliged to check off those who attend for contact tracing purposes (we were challenged through the week that this is not the case - a quick visit to https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/what-you-can-and-cant-do-under-rules and a scroll down to Places of Worship should clarify this).

It would be great to have a number of volunteers to call upon to be rostered for each weekend's Masses.

FR RICHARD ROHR OFM'S REFLECTION...

INNER AND OUTER FREEDOM: FREEDOM TO LOVE

Everything is a manifestation of divine radiance. Love rushes everywhere, in everyone, in everything. —Paula D'Arcy

My friend Paula D'Arcy leads and attends retreats where people from many different backgrounds come to face their deepest grief, insecurities, and anger to find the freedom that lies on the other side. She shares one of her own experiences here:

There is a love which itself has the power to free the human heart. Many remarkable people live in testament to this love, even though they are held in jail cells and prisons, or suffer the harsh conditions imposed by poverty, [racism,] adversity, war, and occupation. The truth of this love is that, if we can be uprooted from our daily preoccupations and taken by direct experience into its presence, then a profound transformation is possible. Whoever arrives at this place looks at the world differently. The distinctions on the surface no longer exist. Here it is possible to suspend our certainties and touch something greater: the Spirit within us.

Bedouins, and Palestinians. . . . We solved by love, and love alone. all expressed a longing for freedom, while having little idea what that meant, or might

demand. We were about to touch the fire of Spirit, embedded not only deep within our own [bodies], but in all life. I recorded our journey through those days, and this telling is excerpted from my journal....

I don't want to see that how I participate in the world is often less than love, and that the environment in which we all live is the result of our sense of entitlement and greed. I don't want to know what freedom demands and what dedication to love and peace may require. Words from the poet Rumi haunt my thoughts: his saying that, in order to live in this world, you have to be truly and completely in love. . . .

Love does not come as theory. It moves in bodies, in nature, in the ground beneath us and the space between. True Love is not emotional. It is a different nature, waiting in us like a secret seed. The illusion is thinking that, by changing a system, an ideology, or our external circumstances, things will change. No; freedom is . . . realizing that this Love is not a symbol or an ideal; it is a living power....

And I understood what it could mean if we met the outer world with our inner world. . . .

In January 2014, I met the fire of There is a living love that exceeds that inner heart. The outer our circumstances and our circumstances were the ten days I conditioning. That's the truth we spent at a retreat centre in all must find. The profound California with thirty other men problems of hatred, judgment, and women. . . . We were [racism,] and revenge, our Americans, Mexicans, Israelis, jealousies and our violence, will be

AN INVITATION TO A DEEPER VIRTUE

jealousy, double-standard, and rigid murder itself, and give back graciousness, to, but their virtues.

What was the virtue of the Scribes and Pharisees? In fact, they had a pretty high Admittedly, this isn't easy, either in theory beyond these?

In Jesus's view, what's wrong is that, in the end, it's still too easy. Any good person does these things, simply on the basis of decency. What's wrong is that ultimately we still give back in kind, an eye for an eye—dollar for dollar, goodness for goodness, kindness for kindness, slight for slight, hatred for hatred, murder for Nothing is ever really transformed, moved beyond, redeemed, transcended, forgiven.

Simply put, if I'm living the virtue of the Scribes and Pharisees, I react this way: if you come to me and say, "I like you! You're a wonderful person," my response naturally will be in kind: "I like you too! Obviously you're a wonderful person!" What I'm doing is simply feeding your own good energy back to you. But that has a nasty underside: if you come to me and say, "I hate you! You're a charlatan and a hypocrite," my response will also be in kind: "I hate you too! Clearly you're a very petty person!" This is ultimately what "an eye for an eye" morality, strict justice, comes down to. We end up feeding back the other's energy, good or bad, and replicating the other's virtue, good or bad. That's the natural way, but it's not the Christian way.

It's precisely here where Jesus' invites us "beyond", beyond natural reaction, beyond instinct, beyond giving back in kind, beyond legal rights, beyond strict justice, beyond the need to be right, beyond even the ten commandments, beyond the virtue of the Scribes and Pharisees.

Indeed the litmus-test for Christian Liturgy, University of St Louis) orthodoxy is not the creed (can you

believe this set of truths?) but this particular challenge from Jesus: can you love an enemy? Can you avoid giving back in kind? Much of what is inside of justice in all things, compassion for the conventional wisdom, pop psychology, poor, and the practice of hospitality, and contemporary spirituality, will object constituted their ideal for virtuous living, to the very theory of it, pointing out that What's wrong with that? What's required carrying tension isn't healthy for us, telling us that we have a duty not to enable abusive behavior, and challenging us not to be doormats and victims, but mature persons who claim the legitimate space that's needed in order to be free, giving persons, responsible to God, others, and self, apposite to developing our innate potentials and bringing our gifts to the world. All of these objections are right, of course, though none of them negate Jesus' challenge. His invitation, cleansed from overly-simplistic interpretation, remains: don't be a victim or a doormat or an enabler of abusive behaviour, but do consider, willingly and without resentment, laying down your life for others by living this more sublime challenge.

> And it's exactly on this point, to do this willingly and without resentment, that its practice grows difficult. It's not easy to do this and not grow resentful and manipulative. More commonly, we carry others' crosses—but end up being bitter about it and sending them the bill. The Scribes and Pharisees had this down to an fine art. That too was part of their virtue. Growing resentful or manipulative while serving others is a perennial danger, though, as Goethe says: "The dangers of life are many and safety is one of them."

> And so the invitation of Jesus to what's higher, more sublime, more noble, remains; as does the gentle, understanding, faithful, non-threatening, non-coercive, non guilt-inducing, but persistent and uncompromising, presence of God.
