#### HOW TO ATTEND MASS

The current public health restrictions limit the number who can be present in each of our churches (65 people for Killara church and 61 for Lindfield). We also must keep a record of everyone who attends for contact tracing purposes by the government in the event of an outbreak.

The easiest way for us to get that information and for you to ensure a spot at Mass is to make an online booking — this is very simple, taking only a few seconds. Just go to the special hotlink box on the homepage of our parish website (<a href="www.lindfieldkillara.org.au">www.lindfieldkillara.org.au</a>). Or call the Parish Office and we'll book for you. Of course you can just turn up for Mass and provide your contact details to the welcomer if spaces remain available.

#### WE HAVE A COVID SAFETY PLAN

- We adhere to maximum number of person permitted in the church based on the four square metre rule
- Green ticks on the seats indicating seating positions ensure maximum separation
- ♦ All are asked to sanitise their hands on entering & leaving We ask all who attend to wear a face mask
- The pews etc are sanitised after every Mass
- There is no congregational singing and no physical exchange of the sign of peace.
- All are asked to maintain 2 metre spacing when coming forward for Holy Communion (which is given on the hand only and not on the tongue).

### Food for the Soul.....

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink. (Mt 25:35)

#### GIVE DRINK TO THE THIRSTY

When we think of the essentials of the Christian faith we generally associate these with belief in a certain creed, acceptance of various dogmas, adherence to a certain moral code, especially as it pertains to private morality, involvement with a church community, and with having some personal relationship to Christ in our lives.

Now, while these things are essential and may never be denigrated, Jesus would add something else. For him, a criterion, in fact *the* criterion, for the practice of the Christian faith is the exercise of the corporal works of mercy. Have we fed the hungry? Given drink to the thirsty? Clothed the naked?

Jesus' command to practice the corporal works of mercy is direct, uncompromising, and everywhere present in the entire New Testament. Taken as whole, every tenth line in the New Testament is a direct challenge to the Christian to reach out to the physically poor. In Luke's gospel, it is every sixth line. In the Epistle of James, it is every fifth line. Involvement with the poor is not a negotiable item. This is mandated with the same weight as is any creed, dogma, and moral or spiritual teaching.

And this may never be spiritualised. The command to be involved with the physically poor means just that, the physically poor. It is rationalising when we turn the corporal works of mercy into something less concrete, namely, when we define the physically poor in such a wide sense so as to include everyone—"To feed the hungry can also mean feeding those who are spiritually hungry." "To give drink to the thirsty can also mean giving spiritual nourishment to those who, while affluent materially, are hungry for deeper things." There is a sense in which this is true, but that is not what Jesus intended in Matthew 25 and not what the church has perennially intended in its social teachings.

There is a spiritual sense to hunger, thirst, and poverty, but that is addressed elsewhere, both in the New Testament and in church teachings. Reaching out to the deeper, non-material, hungers and thirsts of humanity is what is mandated in the spiritual works of mercy. The words of Jesus in the gospels challenging us to reach out to the physically poor are not intended spiritually. The corporal works of mercy are about reaching out to the physically poor, pure and simple.

So how do we give drink to the thirsty?

Obviously, especially given what has just been said, there is an aspect to this that is brutally concrete. Water is even more important than food. Without water we die, are unable to wash ourselves and our clothing, and are unable to enjoy any quality of life whatever. To lack clean, drinkable water is to lack the first necessity of life. Hence, Jesus' command to give drink to the thirsty is, first of all, about looking around ourselves and our world and trying to provide for every person on this earth clean, drinkable water.

This, given the present situation of the planet, is not easy to do. A long, and mostly morally sanctioned, history of privilege and inequality—wherein some of us have surplus while others lack for basic necessities—has made for a situation in which there is now a rationalised acceptance of the fact that millions of people lack the basic physical necessities for life, including clean drinkable water. Thus, to get water to the thirsty today requires more than just the positive efforts being made by those individuals and agencies which are directly trying to bring clean water into poor areas. What is required, as well, is a change of heart and ultimately a change of lifestyle, by each of us who do have clean water.

As the great social encyclicals of the Church, from Leo XIII through John Paul II, re-iterate over and over, clean water will come to everyone on the planet when those of us who have surplus, of any kind, live fully moral lives, namely when we accept that is it not right to have surplus while other lack necessities:

- God intended the earth and everything in it for the sake of all human beings. ... Thus created goods should flow fairly to all. All other rights, whatever they may be, are subordinated to this principle. (*Popularum Progressio* 22 & *Gaudium et Spes* 69)
- No person or country may have surplus if others do not have the basic necessities. (*Rerum Novarum* 19; *Quadregesimo Anno* 50-51; *Mater et Magistra* 119-121; *Populorum Progressio* 230)

Giving drink to the thirsty involves looking at those principles with more moral courage than we have up to now.

#### FACE MASKS

For the good of public health we'd like to ask that you wear a face mask at Mass if at all possible. We have disposable masks available near the doors, though as keeping up that supply comes at a cost it would be helpful if you could provide your own mask.

Face masks are not recommended for young children.

#### A few practical points:

- Please take used masks home for disposal as it's not possible for us to safely handle a multitude of used masks in the bins.
- to ensure they're effective please make sure they cover the nostrils as well as the mouth
- when coming forward to receive Holy Communion please keep the mask on as you receive the Host; then step 1.5 metres to the side before lowering the mask to place the Host in your mouth. Many thanks.


