SLAVERY-FREE EASTER: THE SWEET, BUT SOMETIMES-BITTER TRUTH ABOUT EASTER CHOCOLATE

Let's Make One Change in 2021, the International Year for the Elimination of Child Labour

Chocolate and Child Labour – A Snapshot

A 2020 Macquarie University report, *Not so sweet: chocolate, slavery and complicit corporations*, found that, "More than two million children under the age of 15 years old work in the cocoa industry in Ivory Coast and Ghana. Many are the children of farm labourers, but others are also sold to farms as bonded labourers from neighbouring Burkina Faso and Mali". Change is happening – join in **Australian Catholic Religious Against Trafficking in Humans' (ACRATH) Slavery-free Easter Chocolate Campaign**: Commit to buying only chocolate that is certified slavery-free. Tell at least five other people about slavery-free chocolate and encourage them to buy it too.

Where to buy chocolate that is certified slavery-free

Look for chocolate with one of the four logos (below) on it – Fairtrade, UTZ or Rainforest Alliance.

There are some slavery-free chocolates available in most large supermarkets and ALDI and Haighs have an extensive range of UTZ certified chocolates and even more leading up to Easter. BE SLAVERY Free has an Easter Chocolate Shopping Guide with information on what chocolate is slavery-free. The 2021 version of this guide will be available mid-March.

A FEW THINGS ABOUT OUR COVID-SAFE PRACTICES

- ◆ It is no longer mandatory to wear a face mask in church—though it is recommended if you are able to do that comfortably. However, in our parish it is **mandatory to wear a mask when coming forward to receive Holy Communion.**
- ◆ When coming forward to receive Holy Communion please keep your face mask on while the minister places the Host on your hands. Then step well to the side, lower your mask & receive Communion, & then replace your mask.
- ◆ When we have a Eucharistic Minister assisting the celebrant in giving Holy Communion at Lindfield (where there is just one central aisle) please come down the aisle single-file and 1.5m apart and then move to one or other minister when you reach the front.

Keeping the time of Lent . . .



Arsad, an Indonesian farmer, had no toilet in his home, so he had to walk into the forest to the open defecation area, even at night or in the rain.

Around 17 percent of Indonesia's rural population practice open defecation, with many unaware that it contributes to spreading diseases.

Arsad's family was often sick and open defecation caused neighbourhood disputes. With the support of Caritas Australia and its partner, Laz Harfa, he took part in hygiene, sanitation and financial management training. He decided to fund the building of a toilet in his house and facilitated others in his neighbourhood to save up for toilets.

Now, Arsad and his family are healthier and have reduced their medical expenses. Their community no longer practices open defecation and is more harmonious. A community event, called "Declaration of Open Defecation-Free" was even held to acknowledge their achievements.

Improved hygiene practices helped Arsad's community during the COVID-19 pandemic. Caritas Australia, through Laz Harfa, also shared prevention measures and distributing soap and masks.

Arsad has inspired his neighbourhood to "Be More". "We help each other, the 'togetherness' is growing. Our solidarity had increased," Arsad says

THE MAJOR NEWS OF THIS LAST WEEK (NO, NOT THE SOAP OPRAH):

We could be forgiven for thinking that the Oprah interview was the heart of last week's news, as, true to form the Australian media gave only passing attention to Pope Francis' historic, and personally heroic, four day visit to Iraq. The following material is drawn from the comprehensive reporting provided by 'The Tablet'.



During the visit the Pope had a private meeting with Grand Ayatollah Sayyid Ali Al-Husayni al-Sistani at al-Sistani's home in Najaf, 160 kilometres south of Baghdad.

Matteo Bruno, director of the Holy See press office, said in a statement: "This morning, in Najaf, the Holy Father met Grand Ayatollah Sayyid Ali al-Husayni al-Sistani. During the courtesy visit, which lasted about forty five minutes, the Holy Father stressed the importance of

cooperation and friendship between religious communities for contributing – through the cultivation of mutual respect and dialogue – to the good of Iraq, the region and the entire human family .

"The meeting was an occasion for the Pope to thank Grand Ayatollah al-Sistani for speaking up, together with the Shiite community, in defence of those most vulnerable and persecuted amid the violence and great hardships of recent years, and for affirming the sacredness of human life and the importance of the unity of the Iraqi people.

"In taking leave of the Grand Ayatollah, the Holy Father stated that he continues to pray that God, the creator of all, will grant a future of peace and fraternity for the beloved land of Iraq, for the Middle East and for the whole world."



Pope Francis also hosted a multi-faith prayer service in Abraham's birthplace, the ruins of the city of Ur, bringing together

representatives of Iraq's many religious traditions, including Christians, Sunni and Shia Muslims, Zoroastrians, Mandaeans and Yazidis. Prayers and readings from across many of Iraq's faith were read, and a variety of Iraqis from religious leaders to students spoke movingly about the significance of religious tolerance and fraternity. The service was held by the ruins of the city of Ur, believed to be the birthplace of Abraham, a figure who unites most of the faiths of Iraq.



Pope Francis concluded his trip with Mass with 10,000 people in Irbil—capital of the Kurdistan autonomous region in northern Iraq, where there are many Syrian refugees and hundreds of thousands of displaced people, particularly Christians, from Mosul, Qaraqosh and other towns that had been under the thumb of Islamic State militants. The Pope said in his address: "Here in Iraq, how many of your brothers and sisters, friends and fellow citizens bear the wounds of war and violence, wounds both visible and invisible," the Pope told the crowd. "The temptation is to react to these and other painful experiences with human power, human wisdom", he said, but the path of Jesus was to serve, to heal, to love

and to offer his life for others.".. He went on to say, "The Lord strengthens us to resist the temptation to seek revenge, which only plunges us into a spiral of endless retaliation."

Then Pope Francis addressed the crowd – and those watching on television: "Now the time I must leave for Rome draws near. But Iraq will always remain with me in my heart. I ask all of you, dear brothers and sisters, to work together in unity for a future of peace and prosperity that leaves no one behind and does not discriminate against anyone. I pray that members of the different religious communities, together with men and women of good will, cooperate to strengthen the bonds of fraternity and solidarity at the service of the good and for peace. Salaam, salaam, salaam, shukran and God bless everyone, God bless Iraq, Allah ma'akum (God be with you)."

above all my joys!



Recipe corner

Lentil Moussaka

1kg of potatoes	1 can of lentils
500ml tomato passata	1 tablespoon of oregano
Paprika	1 teaspoon of thyme
2 large eggplants	2 zucchinis
1 onion	2 cloves of garlic
1 carrot	1 capsicum
Olive oil	

Preheat oven to 180 degrees C. Cut potatoes into 1cm slices, put on an oven tray and sprinkle with approx. 2 teaspoons of oregano, paprika, season with salt and pepper and put in the oven until lightly brown.

On a separate oven tray slice the eggplants brush with olive oil, sprinkle with 1 teaspoon of oregano and bake for 20 mins.

Sauté onion and garlic lightly in a pan until soft. Add chopped zucchini, chopped carrot and chopped capsicum cooking for 5 mins.

Add the passata, thyme and remaining oregano. Simmer for 5 mins then add the tinned (cooked) lentils.

Pour half of the mixture in an ovenproof dish.

Top with half the eggplant and potatoes.

Repeat layering of passata mixture, eggplant and potatoes

Top with béchamel using one of the recipes below or your own béchamel recipe.

Béchamel

2 cups of ricotta	1 cup of greek yoghurt
3 eggs, beaten	1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Whisk until combined

Plant based Béchamel:

1 cup cashew nuts soaked in hot water for 10 mins
2 tablespoons of nutritional yeast
1 teaspoon of lemon juice; 1/4 teasp. of mustard powder
5 tablespoons of water; Salt and pepper to taste

Blend all ingredients in an electric blender until smooth

FR RICHARD ROHR OFM'S MEDITATION: THE FULLNESS OF TIME

What some call “liminal space” or threshold space (in Latin, limen means a threshold) is a very good phrase for those special times, events, and places that open us up to the sacred. It seems we need special (sacred) days to open us up to all days being special and sacred. This has always been the case and didn't originate with Christianity. Ancient initiation rites were intensely sacred time and space that sent the initiate into a newly discovered sacred universe.

What became All Saints Day and All Souls Day (November 1-2) were already called “thin times” by the ancient Celts, as were February 1-2 (St. Brigid's Day and Candlemas Day, when the candles were blessed and lit). The veil between this world and the next world was considered most “thin” and easily traversed during these times. On these days, we are invited to be aware of deep time—that is, past, present, and future time gathered into one especially holy moment. We are reminded that our ancestors are still in us and work with us and through us. We call it the “communion of saints.” The New Testament phrase for this was “when time came to a fullness,” as when Jesus first announces the Reign of God (Mark 1:15) or when Mary comes to the moment of birth (Luke 2:6). We are in liminal space whenever past, present, and future time come together in a full moment of readiness. We are in liminal space whenever the division between “right here” and “over there” is obliterated in our

consciousness.

Deep time, or the communion of saints professed in Christian creeds, means that our goodness is not just our own, nor is our badness just our own. We are intrinsically social animals. We carry the lived and the unlived (and unhealed) lives of our parents, grandparents, and great-grandparents as far back as DNA and genomes can trace them—which is pretty far back. It does take a village to create a person. We are the very first generation to know that this is literally and genetically true. There is deep healing and understanding when we honour the full cycle of life. No wonder so many are intrigued today by genealogy searches and ancestry test kits. Many cry and laugh at their newly discovered place in a long family tree about which they knew little.

Living in the communion of saints means that we can take ourselves very seriously (we are part of a Great Whole) and not take ourselves too seriously at all (we are just a part of the Great Whole) at the very same time. I hope this frees us from any unnecessary individual guilt—and, more importantly, frees us to be full “partners in God's triumphant parade” through time and history (2 Corinthians 2:14). We are in on the deal and, yes, the really Big Deal. We are all a very small part of a very Big Thing! We are little happy and content fish in a huge and limitless ocean.
