SEVENTH SUNDAY IN THE EASTER SEASON 16 - 5 - 21
'The season of glad song has come' (Song of Songs 2:12)

This week: Acts 1:1-11; Eph 4:1-13 or Eph 1:17-23; Mk 16:15-20
Next week: Acts 2:1-11; Gal 5:16-25; Jn 15:26-27, 16:12-15



While Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday clearly speak of the *presence* of Jesus and his power in our lives, the feast of the Ascension seems to speak instead of absence: Jesus leaves his disciples, he leaves the world - they feel bereft of his presence.

*But the Ascension is very much an **Easter** feast. It is integrally a part of the Easter Season, and its meaning for our lives can only be understood in reference to Easter itself:*

The risen Jesus is no longer *physically* present in the world which challenges us to consider *how* he is present. The Ascension, as it were asks us 'to look elsewhere':

The risen Jesus is no longer *physically* present in the world, but he is present:

- in the depths of our prayer and contemplation;*
- in the person who needs our love, our forgiveness, our compassion*
- in the person who is judged, condemned, and shunned;*
- in ourselves in our times of pain, of vulnerability, of rejection and dejection.*

When seen with Easter eyes, when seen as an Easter feast, the Ascension is not about the departure of Jesus but rather about his *arrival*.

Food for the soul

FEELING GOD IN VULNERABILITY

Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are one" (Jn:17:11b)

Sometimes we understand things through their absence.

The experience of loneliness teaches us about love. Sometimes too the more painful the absence, the more we're opened to what we're missing. The more fierce and raging the loneliness, the bigger the cavern for love it creates inside of us.⁷

That's true too for our understanding of God and what it means to draw life from God. If loneliness is what we feel when love is absent, what do we feel when God and grace are seemingly absent? And if loneliness stretches our hearts for deeper love, what does a feeling of God's absence create inside of us?

We feel the seeming absence of God whenever we feel these things:

anxiety for no apparent reason,
feelings of guilt we can't explain,
a helplessness we can't do anything about,
fear of death, a nagging sense that something isn't right,
a feeling that somehow we aren't good enough,
a restless drive to make a name for ourselves,
a greedy need to drink in as much life as we can,
and the inchoate feeling that nothing's enough, that we aren't enough, that life isn't enough, that we're standing on the edge of nothingness.

At one level, these feelings can all be explained away as nothing more than neuroses, hang-ups, signs of immaturity, lack of robust health, lack of resiliency, over-sensitivity, as signs that we're weak, over-timid, out-of-sorts.

What's alive is sentient, tender to feeling. It's what's inanimate and dead that's never crippled by feelings. Brute things don't suffer anxiety, rocks don't worry about betrayal, and self-centred egoists aren't concerned about sin. To be anxious, uneasy, haunted by the unseen, and worried that somehow we aren't good enough, can also be a sign of being in touch with something deeper, namely, of being sentient and attuned to the fact that we're creatures and not God, and we must, therefore, be graced and justified by God in order to receive life and salvation.

What does that mean?

Catholics and Protestants have used different languages to explain this, though, in the end, we've both had much the

same concept.

Those of us who were raised Roman Catholics, grew up with the notion of "grace." For us, the key to living was to be always "in the state of grace." The big worry was to die "outside of grace." Negatively, we understood grace as the opposite of sin. Positively, we defined it as being alive inside the Body of Christ.

Protestants mostly used a different language (even as they wrote the timeless hymn, *Amazing Grace*). They spoke of "justification," a concept they took from St Paul. For them, life ultimately had meaning or not, and one entered heaven (or not) on the basis of being justified by God.

But what does that mean?

It isn't an easy concept to grasp or explain. The biblical language is clear, but the concept, like most deep things, is not something we easily get our minds around.

"Justification" (which can also be translated as "Righteousness") is, first of all, something inside of God.

What?

We can only dance around its meaning.

It refers to a substantiality, a wholeness, a goodness, a perfection, and an immortality that we can't imagine but can partially intuit through our experience of its absence.

What are we missing that God has?

Classical theology defined God as "*Ipsum Esse Subsistens*," self-sufficient being. God alone does not need anything outside of Self in order to come into existence and remain in existence. Everything else, including every human person, and humanity itself, needs someone or something outside of itself to be born and to stay in existence. Alone, all by ourselves, we lack a meaning and a goodness that we're powerless to give ourselves. Alone we do stand on the brink of nothingness—and, when we're sensitive and attuned to things, we know it!

What we lack is what's inside God—substance, life, meaning, beauty, goodness, community, love. Only God can give these to us. Classically, for Roman Catholics, God gives them to us through grace; for Protestants, God gives them through justification. Either way, there's no life, no meaning, and no future outside of this gift.

UPDATE ON COLES DEVELOPMENT

Our Parish and Parish School had a meeting last week with the team involved in the Coles re-development and we can give you an update on what's on the timetable.

The redevelopment involves several stages:

- ◆ **Stage 1:** The relocation of Ausgrid cables so that the green transformer boxes in Balfour Lane can be re-located onto the Balfour St footpath. This will commence shortly and will take about 16 weeks to complete.
- ◆ **Stage 2:** The re-location of Balfour Lane to the western boundary of the current outdoor carpark (the existing lane will not close until the new lane is ready to open so we have continuous access to our site). This will commence once the above-mentioned cables have been re-located. During this period the southern end of the existing outdoor Coles carpark will remain in use (the northern end will be used for construction equipment)
- ◆ **Stage 3:** Once the lane re-location is complete the main part of the project will begin. The existing Coles supermarket will close and be demolished. The site of the present Coles plus all of the outdoor carpark will be a construction zone for: a. two levels of underground parking; above which will be the new expanded Coles supermarket; above which will be a level of residential parking; above which will be apartments. This main part of the project will commence around February next year and will take around two years to complete.

There'll be some pain getting to the end of this process but ultimately we will benefit from access to twice the amount of parking currently available in the outdoor carpark. *Fr Colin*



FR RICHARD ROHR OFM'S MEDITATION: THE GREAT LOVE SONG

Carl McColman has written many accessible books on spirituality, the mystics, and contemplative prayer. Here he explores a biblical book of "bridal mysticism" and also offers an example of a modern mystic who experienced this kind of union with God.

"God is love" (1 John 4:16) may be the single most important verse in the entire Bible. . . . Is it any wonder that many of the great Christian mystics are renowned as lovers of God? This can take a variety of forms: for some, being God's lover is very ethereal and philosophically abstract; but for others, an embodied, physical, even erotic quality characterizes their mysticism of love. There is even a term—"bridal mysticism"—for the many mystics (both female and male) whose experience of profound love of God was so deep and all-encompassing that it led to a spiritual sense of being "married" to God. . . .

[It's important to] consider that this derives from the Bible itself. One of the loveliest books in the Hebrew Bible . . . is the Song of Solomon, also called the Song of Songs or the Canticle of Canticles. . . . It is the story of a bride and bridegroom, their passion for one another, their devotion to one another, and their (strongly hinted at) passion as physical lovers.

Historically, the Song of Songs has been read as a kind of allegory: the two lovers symbolize the caring relationship between God and Israel, or Christ and the Church, or Christ

and the individual believer. This is where the mysticism of love comes in. . . .

Elizabeth of the Trinity [1880–1906] serves as a wonderful modern example of a bridal mystic. She entered the Carmelite order at age twenty-one and died only a few years later, but her legacy of letters and other writings reveals a deep sense of God's presence in her life, a presence luminous with love. As she wrote in one of her letters, "I feel so much love over my soul, it is like an Ocean I immerse and lose myself in: it is my vision on earth while waiting for the face-to-face vision in light. [God] is in me, I am in Him. I have only to love Him, to let myself be loved, all the time, through all things: to wake in Love, to move in Love, to sleep in Love, my Soul in His Soul, my heart in His Heart, my eyes in His eyes . . ." [1]

Elizabeth prayed that God would make her soul his heaven. In doing so, she recognised the heart of the mystery: that heaven is not just a place we go after we die, it is a state into which we are invited now.
