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We live in a culture of *blame* and *expectation*: most of the print space of our papers and the sound bites of our media reflect the everyday views of citizens:

we live in a most privileged of societies and yet are so aware of what <u>isn't</u> happening the way we want it to:

<u>complaint</u> is the bread and butter of the media. But perhaps it only reflects the mindset of its readers, viewers and listeners?

Which is perhaps why today's Gospel is the least practised passage in the Scriptures:

turn the other cheek, give them your cloak as well as your tunic.

We're more likely to be aware of how we're being mistreated than of how we could go the extra mile.

Yet here is the heart of the Gospel. *Its very difficult heart.* **But does it describe our own heart?**

Mass is celebrated Monday to Friday in our parish. The weekday Eucharist takes just 25 minutes but offers a precious opportunity to be nourished by the daily Lenten Scripture readings and to draw closer to the Lord in the Eucharist.

On Desire . . .

 $\mathbf{Part} \mathbf{3}^{3}$

'Mary Magdalene does not see Jesus until he calls her by name: "Jesus said to her, 'Mary.' She turned and said to him in Hebrew, 'Rabboni!' She sees the one whom she loved . . . At the call of her name, she opens her eyes and sees that love is not defeated. And it is "the disciple whom Jesus loved" who goes into the tomb, sees and believes. It is the same beloved disciple who will see Jesus on the beach and say, "It is the Lord." It is these two people, a man and a woman, whose love is so evident, who first see and believe . . . **Believing is seeing with loving eyes**. Why did Jesus not appear to Pilate or Caiaphas the High Priest? Might not one quick appearance have proved that they were wrong? **Surely it is because if you do not have loving eyes then you cannot see the risen Lord. If you look at people with censorious and cynical eyes, then you will remain blind and the Eucharist will just seem to be a few odd people queuing up for a fragment of bread.' ¹**

So unless we have a proper sight - insight - then desire will beout of order in our life. As disciples our challenge is to desirewhat is best and most noble, to desire what has true beauty, tohave our desire driven by love (in the truest sense of that word),ultimately to desire*God*. But our world teaches us to be cynical,it teaches us to be judgemental. It teaches us to see only what isgoing wrong. It teaches us to see what is worst in people. Thenightly News is the day's*bad*news – it doesn't report the tenthousand random acts of goodness that have also taken placethat day. And as we are tutored into cynicism and negativityabout human nature then desire, as a means of*love*, isexchanged for desire as a means of trying to fill the void withinus; it becomes consumption for consumption's sake; it becomesthe attempt to try to fill our emptiness with*things*because wehave given up trying to find God, trying to find God in others.

'Believing is seeing with loving eyes'. So says Timothy Radcliffe. There's one of our challenges as disciples, perhaps our greatest challenge. Believing is not some mere intellectual exercise – if we are believers then we **see** differently, we see the world differently, we see people differently. And we *desire* differently: our desire is shaped by what can really make us most human, what can most make us what we were created to be.

Do we **believe**? Do we 'see with loving eyes'? That has to be one of the great questions that every disciple has to face. And it could be a life-changing question to face during the coming days of Lent.

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THE POPE'S WORLDWIDE PRAYER NETWORK

AND

A WALKING "THE WAY OF THE HEART" RETREAT AT THE ART GALLERY OF NSW

Pope Francis has invited all of us as one body of Christ to be a part of The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network . This is essentially the new name for the Apostleship of Prayer that has been established in the tradition of the Church for over 150 years. A lot of people are not familiar with the fact that the Jesuits have always been tasked with promoting this ministry. This has been since Fr Claude Colombiere SJ accompanied Sr Margaret Mary Alocoque as her spiritual director in the 1700's. She was the nun who, in Paray le Monial in France, had visions of Jesus with the exposed heart on fire, pierced and bearing the crown of thorns. Pedro Arrupe SJ has also written and spoken beautifully of this deep love of Christ for us and how this devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus can transform our lives. Pope Francis' "Way of the Heart" is the reinvigoration of this devotion. It is a retreat program that takes the devotion off the walls of homes and into our hearts by aligning it with the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius.

If you would like to have a small taste of it, Anne Gray, who is a Parishioner and also the Australian Coordinator of the Pope's Prayer Network is offering A WALKING "THE WAY OF THE HEART" RETREAT AT THE ART GALLERY OF NSW with art on March 2, or March 18 or March 25 (see notice on page 1). Ideally the Way of the Heart is done over nine months on the first Friday of every month and there are 9 steps. It is the foundation program for the Pope's prayer app called <u>clicktopray.org</u> Why not check the app out? Or email Anne at <u>info@pwpnaustralia.org</u> if you are interested in the whole retreat program.

If we look at it too logically, we may say, "Well, that's a misuse of words." We might say that God doesn't have balance, we don't read the prophets. That's not their pain, feeling, desire, or anger. Yet prophets dare to use vocation. They're not called to be that. In a world that's so those words and images because the prophets are speaking one-sided, always looking for the self-preserving, careful, to us. The prophet knows that these are words we can understand, that we can enter into, and that will somehow assimilate us into the heart of God....

Let's come at it the other way around. We know and we feel; if we are children of God, then somehow what characterizes our heart and humanity must be reflected in who God is. Maybe the only way to get a handle on who God is, is to speak of desire, to speak of anger, to speak of longing, to speak of love. And so we dare to do it, and the prophet dares to do it.

Scholar and activist Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel (1907-1972) describes the shared experience of feeling between God and a prophet:

pathos, a communion with the divine consciousness.... The The prophets provide a journey into the heart of God. Their typical prophetic state of mind is one of being taken up

approaches to God. If we're looking for prudence & cautious, & protective way, the prophet feels they must stand way over at a distance & pull humanity to the other side. They must help humanity experience the pathos of God, the pain, the feeling, the longing, the desire of God....

If teachers give us the ideas of God, then prophets give us the feelings of God. This helps us see Jesus as both prophet and teacher. Jesus speaks the word of God, the ideas of God, but combines with them the feelings of God. That's what it means to have a whole understanding of reality. We know so much more than we understand, at least if we're listening. If we're learning how to listen, we know so much more than we understand. What the prophets do is help us to know what we know.
