Transfiguration or disfiguration?



The Transfiguration celebrates that the divine depths of Jesus are revealed in his humanity. As such it celebrates that because of the incarnation, death and resurrection of Jesus the humanity of each human being contains depths that are divine: that at the heart of each person is the indwelling presence of the God who created them.

Which means that we're called to see,
to recognise,
and to honour
those divine depths in our neighbour.

The transfiguration of Jesus on a mountain 2000 years ago is pointless if it doesn't lead us to recognise that transfiguration, that revelation of divine depths, in our neighbour. Jesus, after all, came to redeem, to bring life.

When we see, and when we treat, our fellow human beings in any way less than this we have disfiguration, not transfiguration.

APOSTOLIC LETTER
SUBLIMITAS ET MISERIA HOMINIS
OF THE HOLY FATHER FRANCIS
ON THE FOURTH CENTENARY OF THE BIRTH OF BLAISE PASCAL
PART 3

The philosophers

Many of Pascal's writings are steeped in the language of philosophy. This is especially true of his *Pensées*, the collection of fragments, published posthumously, that are his notes and sketches for a philosophy inspired by a theological concern. Scholars have attempted, with varying results, to restore the collection's original form and unity. Pascal's passionate love for Christ and for serving the poor, which I mentioned earlier, were not so much the sign of a disconnect in the mind of this bold disciple, as of a deeper growth towards evangelical radicalism, a progression, aided by grace, towards the living truth of the Lord. Pascal, who possessed the supernatural certitude of faith and considered it fully compatible with reason while infinitely surpassing the latter, sought as much as possible to engage in dialogue with those who did not share his faith. For "to those who do not have faith, we cannot give it except by reasoning, as we wait for God to give it to them by moving their heart". Here we see a completely respectful and patient form of evangelization that our generation would do well to imitate.

It is necessary then, for a proper understanding of Pascal's thinking on Christianity, to be attentive to his philosophy. He admired the wisdom of the ancient Greek philosophers, who sought with simplicity and tranquillity to live well as citizens of a polis: "We think of Plato and Aristotle as wearing the flowing robes of scholars. They were normal people, like everyone else, who enjoyed a good laugh with their friends. When they were composing their Laws and Politics, they did it for pleasure. It was the least philosophical and least serious part of their life; the

most philosophical part was to live simply and peaceably". Yet for all their greatness and their usefulness, Pascal recognized the limits of those philosophies: Stoicism leads to pride; scepticism to despair. Human reason is a marvel of creation, which sets man apart from all other creatures, for "man is but a reed, the weakest in nature, yet he is a thinking reed". The limits of the philosophers are thus, quite simply, the limits of created reason. Democritus might well say, "I am going to speak about everything", but reason cannot, of itself, resolve the deepest and most urgent issues. In the end, both for the age of Pascal as well as for our own, what remains the greatest and most pressing question? It is that of the overall meaning of our destiny, our life and our hope, which is directed to a happiness that we are not forbidden to imagine as eternal, but which God alone can grant: "Nothing is as important to man as his own state; nothing to him is as fearsome as eternity".

In reflecting on Pascal's *Pensées*, we constantly encounter, in one way or another, this fundamental principle: "reality is superior to ideas". Pascal teaches us to keep our distance from "various means of masking reality", from "angelic forms of purity" to "intellectual discourse bereft of wisdom". Nothing is more dangerous than a disembodied reason: "He who would act as an angel, acts as a beast". The baneful ideologies from which we continue to suffer in the areas of economics, social life, anthropology and morality, keep their followers imprisoned in a world of illusions, where ideas have replaced reality. *(to be continued.)*

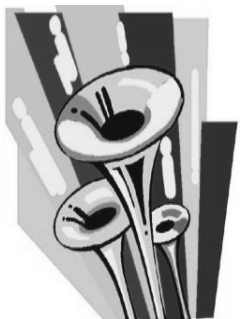

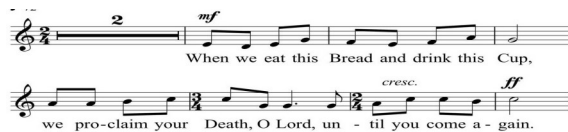

MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION



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FR RICHARD ROHR OFM'S MEDITATION . . . BRINGING FORTH NEW LIFE

If you find yourself in a monastery do not go to another place, for that will harm you a great deal. Just as the bird who abandons the eggs she was sitting on prevents them from hatching, so the monk or the nun grows cold and their faith dies, when they go from one place to another.

—Amma Syncletica, *Life of Blessed Syncletica*

Episcopal priest and writer Mary Earle finds inspiration for spiritual practice in the sayings of a Desert Mother known as Syncletica of Alexandria:

Amma Syncletica is counseling us to not run from ourselves. She is encouraging us to stay faithfully with whatever new life is being hatched within us....

She is addressing a universal human temptation—to miss our lives by living completely on the surface. After all, our culture encourages competition and ambition, and we are highly mobile. If we are not careful, that mobility can create a kind of rootlessness that will injure us and those with whom we live and move and have our being. This is the kind of rootlessness that is internal, that is caused by our not staying with anything long enough to grow deep roots....

In the desert, men and women were counseled, “Go to your cell and your cell will teach you everything.” [1] ... The cell was a sacred space, a place in which a woman could be with herself and the divine Presence and listen. The cell was a place of divine encounter and of ongoing, daily experience of being immersed in God’s presence.

The wisdom of the desert tempers our instinct to avoid boredom and discomfort:

Amma Syncletica’s [bird] metaphor speaks directly to one of the dilemmas of the spiritual life—that of coming to terms with the plain old ordinariness of spiritual practice and the life of prayer, of the whole of life becoming prayer.... We are enticed by a variety of means to leave our “eggs” and simply move continually from one interest to another. The result is that we don’t allow ourselves the opportunity to bring forth new life. The “eggs” die because they are not tended. We miss the deeper life of the Spirit because we are constantly moving from one interest to another rather than focusing on one thing.

Our ancient mothers knew that when boredom threatened, it could very well be the outward and visible sign of God’s secret, hidden, inner work within the human heart and soul. Consequently, they emphasized staying in the cell, in the little room of daily living, and letting that cell be their teacher....

Staying in the cell, or “sitting on the eggs,” means noticing our appetite for overstimulation. The cell teaches us to slow down, ... to notice what is right in front of us. The wisdom the desert mothers offer us is that by staying with ourselves, with our inner ups and downs, with our hurts and our fears, we will bring forth the new life that God is creating within us.

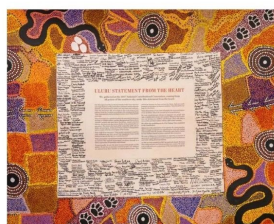
