'Wherever I am my servant will be there too.'

Is that true? Are we to be found where Jesus is?

LENT

From the Gospels it's clear that Jesus hangs around the poor, the outcast, the socially unacceptable person, and above all, around the ones everyone else calls sinners.

Today's question is: do we?

Jesus' band of followers included extortionists, political extremists and prostitutes: the sort of people that many of his followers today tend to despise and judge.

'Wherever I am, my servant will be there too.' Not long after saying that Jesus' arms were stretched wide on the Cross. His love wasn't abstract - it was very concrete. This Sunday of Lent asks us whether love is just a four-letter word for us or whether it takes on very real flesh and blood in our life: whether it's true that 'wherever I am, my servant will be there too.' *Fr Colin*

About Palm Sunday

Next Sunday, 24th March, is the sixth Sunday of Lent – Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, our entry into Holy Week.

Two important things about this beautiful day:



FIRSTLY, as pre-cut palms have become so expensive we need to ask you all to bring palm pieces in preparation for Palm Sunday. They can be left in the baskets at the church doors today or anytime this week between Tuesday-Friday during office hours.

SECONDLY, as usual we will have an ecumenical entry into Holy Week. Our sisters and brothers from Lindfield Uniting Church will join us for the blessing and procession of palms. To do this each of our churches will slightly alter the time of our celebration. Thus the usual 10:15am Mass will begin at the earlier time of 10:00am with the blessing of palms in the courtyard of MacKillop Hall.

HOLY SATURDAY

MORNING PRAYER: 10am in Lindfield church

(Holy Saturday is traditionally a day of solemn vigil [and fast], of waiting for the resurrection. Mass and the sacraments are not celebrated on this day. However, to spend some of this vigil of prayer together, there will be MORNING PRAYER at 10am in Lindfield church.

Since it is the principal celebration of the entire Church year we will again have a single celebration of the Easter Vigil for the whole parish. This will be celebrated in Holy Family church at Lindfield and we hope that everyone from both the Killara and the Lindfield communities in the parish can come:

> MASS OF THE EASTER VIGIL : THE CELEBRATION OF THE RESURRECTION: 7:30PM on Holy Saturday (in our Lindfield church)

This is the most important and beautiful Mass in our Church's year and the principal Easter celebration. Please be there, rain, hail or shine!

The Easter Vigil will be followed by a Parish Easter Party in St Brigid's Hall. Please keep the time for this parish party free to continue the Easter celebration as a community. Please bring a plate if you can.



Our coming Parish Assembly: a change of date - AND some more info...

As you know, Pope Francis is calling the Church to a more 'synodal' way of being and acting - working together, collaborating and dialoguing, so as to discern God's path for us.

Our Parish Pastoral Council has therefore agreed that, in addition to the PPC's own role of representing the parish, we will *as a whole parish*, come together in a synodal assembly as it were, once or twice a year to reflect, listen and discuss so as to discern what God's Spirit is calling us to be and to do as a parish community.

The date for our first parish gathering has been changed to Sunday 5th May beginning with brunch after 10:15am Mass and then a time of discernment together until 2pm.

What is this about?

'Synodal' comes from two Greek words meaning 'travelling on the road together'

Pope Francis invites us to discern with *the Holy Spirit* (rather than our own will!) is calling us to be and to do.

By gathering and *listening* and discussing we aim to identify the priorities for our parish life and ministry to which God is calling us.
