

Would that we realized the truth of that! If we recognized how the Holy Spirit is present in everything-physical creation, love, human creativity, and morality-perhaps we could hold more things together in a fruitful tension rather They could not explain these things scientifically the way

What does this mean?

We have too many unhealthy dichotomies in our lives. Too often we find ourselves choosing between things that should not be in opposition to one another and we are in the unhappy position of having to pick between two things which are both, in themselves, good.

Thus, we live in a world within which, generally speaking, the spiritual is set against the physical, certain moral precepts are set against creativity, wisdom is set against education, commitment against sex, conscience against were not set against each other. One spirit was understood pleasure, and personal fidelity against creative and to be the source of both. We need to understand things in professional success.

But obviously there is something wrong here. Is this true?

when we find morality without creativity, when our wisdom spurns education, when our commitments are sterile, when our conscience has a problem with pleasure, and when our personal fidelity is defensive in the face of art and achievement. FR RICHARD ROHR OFM'S MEDITATION:

Theologian Serene Jones offers a compelling description of God's ever-present and transformative grace:

Divine love is the source of the universe and of the alongside the realities of sin and evil: dinosaurs, the planets, the elements, and the air, the force that sparked us into existence and baffles us all while we exist, the current of love and joy and beauty that runs through the human experience.... All life flows into being out of one source, Divine Love, and it is forever deeply related and responsive to that love. That love defines, holds, and promises to be present to the lives that God calls into being. That eternally present love is, most simply stated, my definition of grace...

God does not stay at a distance from us but constantly seeks cultural patterns that look to us as if they are true, when in to transform our lives by asking us to awaken to the divine truth they are not. They are evil and profoundly destructive. presence. God is a mysterious, creative, sustaining life force. This is what it means to be godless—to not be awakened to ... God is there all the time. The challenge for us is to open the light of God's love. It describes grace-asleep people as our eyes, ears, hands, minds, and hearts to receive the truth well as whole grace-asleep societies... of God's real, persistent presence, God's grace. When we open ourselves to it, we are changed by it. The way we perceive the world shifts, like a radically refocused camera lens, and we experience life differently. You see everything around you as suffused with God's love. You see God's grace everywhere, saturating all existence. This process of awakening to what is already true, but you haven't previously seen it, is called conversion-a word that literally means "to see anew."

Jones highlights the paradox of awakening to God's grace

Sin simply refers to all aspects of life where the reality of grace is not manifest and evil flourishes. It's what happens when we've got the wrong story about reality in our heads. If we do not recognise grace, we latch onto lies about who we are. These lies are manifest in an endless variety of godless dispositions: hatred, violence, greed, injustice, pride, despair, isolation, self-loathing, unbridled arrogance, a hardened heart, a cold soul. When these lies are aggregated over time, they get compressed into social systems and

This constant tension between sin and grace in our lived experience doesn't mean, however, that they are equal partners in determining our destiny. Because grace is of God, it ultimately wins. We are forgiven by God, whatever horrors we commit or are done to us, however unmeritorious our deeds and broken our lives, because that's who God is. Grace is free; we don't earn it nor are we required to deserve it. That's what makes grace grace. It comes unbidden to us all.


