

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD SEVENTH SUNDAY IN THE EASTER SEASON

'The Season of Glad Song has come' (Song of Songs 2:12)

This week: Acts 1:1-11; Eph 1:17-23; Luke 24:46-53





While Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday clearly speak of the presence of Jesus and his power in our lives, the feast of the Ascension seems to speak instead of absence: Jesus leaves his disciples, he leaves the world - they feel bereft of his presence.

But the Ascension is very much an Easter feast. It is integrally a part of the Easter Season, and its meaning for our lives can only be understood in reference to Easter itself:

The risen Jesus is no longer physically present in the world which challenges us to consider how he is present. The Ascension, as it were asks us 'to look elsewhere':

The risen Jesus is no longer physically present in the world, but he is present:

- in the depths of our prayer and contemplation;
- in the person who needs our love, our forgiveness, our compassion
- in the person who is judged, condemned, and shunned;
- in ourselves in our times of pain, of vulnerability, of rejection and dejection.

When seen with Easter eyes, when seen as an Easter feast, the Ascension is not about the departure of Jesus but rather

about his arrival. - Fr Colin

What is Jubilee?

According to Judaic tradition, the fields would lie fallow for a 'Sabbath Year' after 6 years of labour. Every seventh Sabbath year was followed by a Jubilee (50 years), during which slaves were released, commercial debts were cancelled, and property was returned to its original owners. This became a year of honouring God.

In the Catholic Tradition, Jubilees are now celebrated every 25 years. Jubilees are a year of pilgrimage, thanksgiving and repentance - it is a year for seeking and giving forgiveness.

In the Papal the Bull **Spes non confundit** Pope Francis talks about the following key themes:

- Forgive debts and give pardons
- Peace for a suffering world
- Hope for the Future
- Christian Unity

Pope Francis hopes that the itineraries and pilgrimages planned during the Jubilee year are "oases of spirituality and places of rest on the pilgrimage of faith" and that shrines may also be places "for the rebirth of hope." Would that we realized the truth of that! If we recognized how the Holy Spirit is present in everything—physical creation, love, human creativity, and morality—perhaps we could hold more things together in a fruitful tension rather. They could not explain these things scientifically the way than so often opposing them and having the different gifts we can, but they recognized, just as we do, that there is of the Holy Spirit fight each other within our lives.

What does this mean?

We have too many unhealthy dichotomies in our lives. Too often we find ourselves choosing between things that should not be in opposition to one another and we are in the unhappy position of having to pick between two things which are both, in themselves, good.

Thus, we live in a world within which, generally speaking, the spiritual is set against the physical, certain moral precepts are set against creativity, wisdom is set against not contradict itself. The physical and the spiritual world education, commitment against sex, conscience against were not set against each other. But obviously there is something wrong here. Is this true?

Is the Holy Spirit both the force of gravity and the source of love? Yes. At least if the Scriptures are to be believed. We first meet the person of the Holy Spirit in the opening line of the bible: "in the beginning there was a formlesss void and the Spirit of God hovered over the waters. ... already some form of love inside all things, however inanimate. They attributed all of this to God's breath, the wind that comes from God's mouth and ultimately animates rocks, water, animals, and human beings.

But they also understood that this same breath that animates and orders physical creation is also the source of all wisdom, harmony, peace, creativity, morality, and fidelity. God's breath, was understood to be as moral as it is physical, as harmonious as it is creative, and as wise as it is fertile. For them, the breath of God was one force and it did that same way. We need to let the Holy Spirit, in all his and her fullness, animate our lives.

What this means concretely is that we must not let

Thus, there should not be in our lives creativity in the absence of morality, education in the absence of wisdom, sex in the absence of commitment, pleasure in the absence of conscience, and artistic or professional achievement in the absence of personal fidelity. Especially there should not be a good life for us in the absence of justice for everyone.

when we find morality without creativity, when our wisdom spurns education, when our commitments are sterile, when our conscience has a problem with pleasure, and when our personal fidelity is defensive in the face of art and achievement. One Spirit is the author of all of these. Hence there must be equal attention paid to each of them.


