

Gospel reading for Next Week 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

A reading from the Gospel of Luke 10:38-42 Martha took up the duties in the house. Mary chose the better part.

But the Lord answered: 'Martha, Martha,' he said 'you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one.
