SELF-REFLECTION: TRUE SAVIOUR

This Sunday's Gospel, John 1:29-34, John the Baptist recognises that Jesus is more than a teacher—He is the long-awaited Saviour who brings forgiveness, renewal, and hope. John's humility reminds us that our mission, too, is to lead others toward Christ, not ourselves.

I reflect:

- Where do I need Jesus' healing and forgiveness in my life right now?
- How can I point others to Christ through my words or actions today?
- Do I recognise the presence of Jesus in the ordinary moments of my life?
- What prevents me from fully trusting in Jesus as the Lamb of God?
- How is the Holy Spirit inviting me to grow in humility, like John the Baptist?

Promised Hope

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, Lamb of God, open my heart to recognise Your presence and Your love. Heal what is wounded, forgive what is sinful, and strengthen what is weak within me. Help me to follow You with humility and to lead others toward Your light. Amen.

First Reading: *Isaiah 49:3, 5-6 (JB)*

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

I will make you the light of the nations so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.

The Lord said to me, 'You are my servant, Israel, in whom I shall be glorified'; I was honoured in the eyes of the Lord, my God was my strength. And now the Lord has spoken, he who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, to gather Israel to him: 'It is not enough for you to be my servant, to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back the survivors of Israel; I will make you the light of the nations so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.'

"Look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world."

GOSPEL *John 1:29-34 (JB)*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

Seeing Jesus coming towards him, John said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world. This is the one I spoke of when I said: A man is coming after me who ranks before me because he existed before me. I did not know him myself, and yet it was to reveal him to Israel that I came baptising with water.' John also declared, 'I saw the Spirit coming down on him from heaven like a dove and resting on him. I did not know him myself, but he who sent me to baptise with water had said to me, "The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and rest is the one who is going to baptise with the Holy Spirit." Yes, I have seen and I am the witness that he is the Chosen One of God.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Readings: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6, 1 Corinthians 1:1-3, and John 1:29-34

Isaiah reminds us that God calls each of us for a purpose beyond ourselves: "I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." Even when we feel ordinary or limited, God can use us to bring His love, mercy, and hope to others. Paul echoes this in his letter to the Corinthians, reminding us that we are saints, called and blessed in Christ. Our identity is found not in our own strength, but in God's grace, which equips us to live faithfully.

In John's Gospel, John the Baptist points to Jesus as the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." John's humility shows us how to live as witnesses: our task is not to draw attention to ourselves, but to point others to Christ. Recognizing Jesus as the Lamb of God invites us to trust Him completely, to allow His forgiveness to heal our hearts, and to share the hope He brings with the world.

Together, these readings call us to see ourselves as part of God's plan: chosen, blessed, and sent to bring His light and hope into the lives of those around us.

Key Thought:

We are called to live as witnesses of God's light and hope, reflecting His love in our everyday lives.

Take-Home Challenge:

This week, look for one practical way to point someone toward Jesus—through encouragement, kindness, or a simple act of service.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, Lamb of God, help me to recognise Your presence in my life and share Your love with others. Strengthen me to be a light to those around me, reflecting Your grace and hope. Amen.
