



ANTI-SLAVERY PETITION: Most people think human trafficking is a thing of the something happens in other countries and not in our developed societies. Yet modern day slavery exists and it exists in many forms - preying on our most vulnerable. Pope Francis describes it as a "crime against humanity". 8 February has been named the feast day of St Bakhita in order to highlight this issue. The Anti-Slavery Taskforce commissioned in 2017 by Sydney Archbishop, Most Reverend Anthony Fisher, is hoping to gather 10,000 signatures so that the government is obliged to address this issue of modern day slavery.

When it is time to renew your <u>WWC NUMBER</u> the Office of the Children's Guardian will contact you three months before its expiry. You must therefore ensure that the Office of the Children's Guardian has your up to date contact details. The <u>WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK</u> lasts for five years so that renewals begin from March 2018 for those who first applied in 2013.
