
Gospel reading for next Week The Ascension of the Lord - Year A

An excerpt from Bishop Anthony Randazzo's letter regarding Stage 1 Re-opening:

In respect to our own context, we can note the following which is possible from Friday 15 May 2020. Each of these provisions is contingent on practising social distancing of 4 square metres per person and hand hygiene through the ready use of sanitiser.

- Churches are able to be open for private prayer, with a limit of 10 people in the church at any one time.
- **Religious gatherings**, either formal or informal, are permissible inside churches for groups not more than 10 people. The names of each person at the gathering must be recorded.
- **Weddings** may be permitted for a group of 10 people. Further clarification received from the NSW Premier's Office has been received advising that the couple and the celebrant are not part of the group of 10 people. Therefore it is permissible for a wedding to include the celebrant, the couple and 10 guests
- **Funerals** may be permitted for groups of 20 people indoors and for 30 people outside, practising social distancing of 4 square metres per person and hand hygiene through the ready use of sanitiser at church entrances.

Message for BBNeighbourhoods 12 May 2020

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This week I am writing to you from the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. The Bishops of Australia meet in Plenary twice a year, in the months of May and November. Normally we gather in North Sydney at the shrine of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop, but lately due to building works, we have been gathering in Melbourne. This year, as we continue to find new ways of living in a COVID-19 environment, I am in the Diocese and we are meeting via video conference.

To be honest, constant video-conferencing is a challenge as not everyone is IT savvy. I am also finding that by the end of each day I am mentally fatigued, so I take to the footpath for a run or walk to clear my head. The experience has given me an even deeper respect for our teachers who have been working double-time to ensure that our children, especially in our Catholic Schools, are able to continue with their studies. The experience has also reinforced for me the marvelous work being carried out by so many parents and carers as technology plays a greater part in family life and learning.

As the Government gradually lifts some of the restrictions, many of us are asking when will we be able to gather once more in our churches for prayer and worship? The Catholic Bishops of NSVV/ACT have written to the Premier offering our recommendations regarding the gradual reopening of our churches. Key to our proposal is the reassurance that our people will continue to maintain the physical distancing required during the health crisis. We would also want to ensure that there is a high level of safety due to thorough cleaning programs. As we continue to dialogue with the Government, I would ask you to pray for the best outcome – the safe reopening of our churches.

In the meantime, I would like to thank the priests, deacons and parish community leaders who are tirelessly reaching out via livestreaming and ongoing pastoral care. A special word of gratitude to the members of my Chancery and Office of the Bishop.

Over the past few weeks, I have received numerous messages from people who are staying connected as well as from people who had been away from our community of the Church and who are reconnecting. It is great to have you with us again as we strive to live as disciples of the Lord.

Please continue to pray for me and the other Australian bishops as we conclude our Plenary on Thursday and be reassured of my constant prayers for you as I bring your needs and intentions to the altar of the Lord.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Isidore the Farmer

Beatified: May 2, 1619, Rome by Pope Paul V

Canonized: March 12, 1622, Rome by Pope Gregory XV

St. Isidore was born at Madrid, Spain, in the latter half of the 12th century.

For the greater part of his life he was employed as a laborer on a farm outside the city. Many marvelous happenings accompanied his lifelong work in the fields and continued long after his holy death.

He was favored with celestial visions and, it is said, the angels sometimes helped him in his work in the fields. St. Isidore was canonized in 1622.

In 1947, he was proclaimed the patron of the National Rural Conference in the United States. He is the patron of farmers, and his feast day is May 15th.

Prayer:

Dear God, through the intercession of St. Isidore, the holy Farmer, grant that we may overcome all feelings of pride. May we always serve You with that humility which pleases You, through his merits and example. Amen.
