

Gospel

Luke 2:16-21 (JB) A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke The shepherds found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the crib ...When the eighth day came they gave him the name of Jesus.

Communion Antiphon

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and for ever.

Monday, December 25

NATIVITY OF THE LORD

Isaiah 52:7-10 Psalm 98:1-6 Hebrews 1:1-6 John 1:1-18 (or Jn 1:1-5, 9-14)

Let all the angels of God worship him. (Hebrews 1:6)

Merry Christmas! On this most joyous day, let's join with the angels and worship our newborn King. *Glory to God in the highest!*

"We praise you, Jesus, Son of God! You came down from heaven to earth! You emptied yourself and became a helpless child to save us. We behold you, asleep beside Mary and Joseph on a bed of straw. The choirs of angels praise you, Lord, and we join with them. We bow down in awe before the humility and love you showed when you took on our human flesh. We thank you, Lord, that you became a son of man so that we might become sons and daughters of God.

"We bless you, Jesus, Mighty Savior! In you the kindness and generous love of God has appeared. You have come to your people Israel and set them free. Even more, you come to show mercy to all nations. Every person on earth can find salvation in you. You come to comfort all who mourn, to raise up all who are bowed down. And you do all this by offering yourself in love. Thank you, Lord, for saving us by your grace!

"We adore you, Jesus, Light of the World! We, the people who walked in darkness, have seen a great light in you. Your glorious light shines in the darkest corners of our world—and of our hearts. No power of evil can prevent your love from reaching us, your sons and daughters. We praise you for this holy day when your light dawned up on the earth!

Sunday, December 31

THE HOLY FAMILY

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 Psalm 128:1-5 Colossians 3:12-21 Luke 2:22-40

The child's father and mother were amazed. (Luke 2:33)

"Amazed." That's how Mary and Joseph reacted when Simeon said that their son would be "a light for revelation" and "glory . . . for Israel" (Luke 2:32). They knew that Jesus was special, but seeing a prayerful, holy man treat him with such awe and reverence left them speechless. Who *was* this child whom God had given them?

This is a perfect image for today's feast of the Holy Family. For all that Mary and Joseph had already experienced, Jesus was still a mystery to them. And he would continue to be a mystery. They would be "astonished" when they found him, at twelve years old, debating with the scribes in the Temple (Luke 2:48). Surely Mary was surprised when Jesus seemed to rebuke her for trying to see him (8:19-21). And imagine her shock when she saw him crucified!

So how did Mary and Joseph respond to the great mystery of their child? With prayerful, open hearts. Luke says that Mary—undoubtedly along with her husband—reflected "in her heart" every time a new challenge arose (2:19). They knew they didn't have all the answers. They needed to be open to God's plan for Jesus rather than respond quickly and rashly based on their own ideas.

What a model for us! Whether we are relating to our parents, our spouse, or our children, we should always approach them with a sense of awe and humility. Because they are "wonderfully made" by God himself, they deserve to be treated with respect and honor (Psalm 139:14). May we never try to impose our plans on them. May we instead be open to God's work in them and love them as he loves them.

Amazed. Prayerful. Humble. Imagine how much peace could flow in families this coming year if we all followed the Holy Family's example!

"Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, pray for all families this year!"



GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

Monday, January 1

MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

Numbers 6:22-27 Psalm 67:2-3, 5-6, 8 Galatians 4:4-7 Luke 2:16-22



In today's Gospel, we find Maryquietly reflecting on all that has led up to the birth of her son. The search for a place to stay, giving birth in a stable, the visit of shepherds—itwas a lot to take in.But rather than grumble, Mary chooses to *reflect* on these bewildering events.

We also find the the shepherds "glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen" (Luke 2:20). As heaven breaks into their lives, these ordinary men respond with great joy and excitedly tell everyone they meet about the newborn Savior and the angels' message.

Are you more likely to ponder or to proclaim? Are you excitedly telling everyone your hopes and dreams for the year? Or are you quietly contemplating the events around you and the stirrings of your own heart? Both responses are appropriate. You may even chose both in the same day!

Like Mary, you can reflect on: how God has surprised you in the past year. Any questions or prayers that you are asking the Lord to answer in the coming year. Like the shepherds, you can share with others a grace that you saw in your life in the past year. Words from Scripture or the Mass that have special meaning to you.

Mary, Mother of God, brought forth Jesus into the world. Now you, too, have the opportunity to bring him forth as you turn your heart to him and share his goodness with those around you.

"Lord, I surrender this year to you. I trust you to lead me in wonder and joy to your perfect plans for me."

Sunday, January 7

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Isaiah 60:1-6 Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-13 Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6 Matthew 2:1-12



In your high school English class, you might have learned that an "epiphany" is the moment when a character is struck with a life-changing realization that changes the rest of the story. Every good novel has one. That's one way to think about the feast we're celebrating today. God revealed himself to the Gentiles, and that moment changed everything.

There had been hints of God welcoming the Gentiles throughout the Old Testament. But Matthew's Gospel shows us this pivotal moment: pagan astrologers from the East came to worship Jesus, the newborn king of the Jews (Matthew 2:11). They are the first of "the nations" whom Isaiah prophesied would walk by the Lord's light (Isaiah 60:3). They are the first of those Paul says will be "coheirs. . . in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (Ephesians 3:6).

Why is that event so important? Because it reveals to us that God's love is far more expansive than anyone had ever thought. We begin to see that in Christ, a loving relationship with God is open to *everyone* who comes to him, Jew or Gentile. That includes you! And your annoying cousin. And the notorious criminal on death row. And the atheist on that YouTube channel. The invitation to come to Jesus extends to everyone. Because God's loving desire to draw all people to himself cannot be contained; no one is excluded from it. And that's a life-changing realization!

Today, as you celebrate this great feast, give thanks to God who loves so extravagantly that he opens his arms wide to welcome everyone who believes. Pray, too, that all people will come to the Lord.
