NATIVITY OF THE LORD

Isaiah 52:7-10 Psalm 98:1-6 Hebrews 1:1-6 John 1:1-18

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. (John 1:14)

Today we join Christians all over the world in celebrating the birth of Jesus. Today we rejoice that God has come to save us. And today we kneel before the manger in awe and gratitude. O come, let us adore him.

The Word. . . This child in Mary's arms is no ordinary infant. No, he is the Word who existed from the beginning. He is the image of the invisible God! Jesus, the unseen Word who created everything, has become visible in human flesh. Now we can see this God who loves us and made us. Not only that, but we can know him personally. Through Jesus, the God who made the world is now remaking it. He is making all things new, including our relationship with God. O come, let us adore him.

became flesh. . . Jesus, the divine Word, has emptied himself to take on our human flesh. He came to do for us what we could not do on our own. We could not enter heaven; we could not become like him; we could not save ourselves. So in his mercy, the eternal Son descended to us in order to save us from sin and death. By freely choosing to share our human condition, he embraced all our weakness and suffering. The world has never seen such love before! O come, let us adore him.

THE HOLY FAMILY

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 Psalm 128:1-5 Colossians 3:12-21 Luke 2:41-52

Put on love. (Colossians 3:14)

A wise man once joked, "It's called *Holy*Matrimony because so many holy martyrs are made there!" When you add children into the mix, the opportunities for "martyrdom" rise exponentially.

Jokes aside, the Holy Family was holy because each member decided to put on love— to sacrifice their own preferences and give of themselves to one another. Whether it was Mary and Joseph's patience in the face of anxiety or misunderstanding or Jesus' humble, obedient return to Nazareth, their holiness shone through their care for one another (Luke 2:48-49, 51).

As you celebrate the Holy Family today, know that you grow in holiness *through*your vocation to family life, not in spite of it. God designed us to be part of a family, whether as a spouse, parent or child. That means you can become holy as you imitate the Holy Family in your own family.

Even more, you are called to build a "civilization of love," as St. John Paul II said in his "Letter to Families." It's a civilization that starts with that foundational building block of the family and reaches outward. It grows as each member gives themselves to God, and then in love, gives of themselves to other people. John Paul said that when we're faithful to our vocation, whether as a married person, or as a single person, priest, or religious, our witness of love affects everyone around us.

So take some time today to reflect on how your family can help you grow in holiness. Think about how you can put on the virtues St. Paul describes in today's second reading, and, over them all, love (Colossians 3:12-14). And then allow yourself to dream of how your decisions to love might just change civilization.

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

Saturday January 1 2022

MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

Numbers 6:22-27 Psalm 67:2-3, 5-6, 8 Galatians 4:4-7 Luke 2:16-21

Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. (Luke 2:19)

Happy New Year! All of us here at *The Word Among Us*pray that God will shower you and your loved ones with many blessings in 2022.

Today is also the day when we honor the Virgin Mary with the title Mother of God. We honor her not only as the earthly mother of Jesus of Nazareth, but as the God-bearer, the immaculate Virgin who gave the Son of God flesh and blood. This feast tells us that Mary is not just Jesus' biological mother; she is his Jesus' spiritual mother as well. Think of all the spiritual lessons that Mary taught Jesus. It was from her that he first heard the words, "May it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). Just imagine the child Jesus drinking in these words and turning them into his own prayer: "Your will be done" (Matthew 6:10; see John 8:29; Matthew 26:42). Or think of how Mary taught him humility as well as openness to the Holy Spirit and unbending trust in his heavenly Father. Just imagine how many other ways this holy, loving, and prayerful woman helped to guide his early life!

Not all of us have mothers, spiritual or otherwise, to guide us in our faith. But we all have Mary, the perfect spiritual mother. Through her prayers of intercession, she continues to care for us. Through her example in Scripture and her messages in places like Lourdes and Fatima, she continues to teach us how to reflect on the word of God. And through her motherly love, she is always ready embrace us and draw us closer to her Son. Truly, she is blessed among women—and we are blessed to have her!

"Jesus, thank you for sharing your mother with us! Holy Mary, pray for us! May this be a year of blessing and growth for all your children!"

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Isaiah 60:1-6 Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-13 Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6 Matthew 2:1-12

They . . . offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matthew 2:11)

Gold, frankincense, and myrrh: these are gifts fit for a king. Through them, the magi were not only acknowledging Jesus as Israel's king, but they were also showing Mary and Joseph how honored they were to be in the presence of royalty.

Today is the feast of the Epiphany. At Mass on this special day, you'll also be in the presence of royalty: Jesus, the King of all creation. So how can you honor Jesus? You won't have gold, frankincense, and myrrh to offer, but here's what can you give him:

"Jesus, King of kings, in place of *gold*, I honor you as my king by offering you my obedience and making you the Lord of my life. Out of love for you, I want to be your loyal subject by spreading the good news and building your kingdom on earth. Help me to listen to the promptings of your Holy Spirit, and give me the grace and courage to carry out your every command.

"Jesus, Son of God, instead of *frankincense*, I offer you my praise. Let it rise as incense to your throne (Psalm 141:2). I praise you for coming to earth as a human being so that you could save me. I praise you for suffering and dying for me so that I could live with you forever. Give me the grace to praise you not just in good times but in my difficulties and challenges as well.

"Jesus, Lamb of God, in place of the *myrrh* that anointed your body (John 19:39), I offer you myself, body and soul, along with all my joys and sorrows. I trust that as I surrender myself to you, you will carry me through every temptation and trial and one day bring me safely home to your eternal kingdom.

"Jesus, you are my King, Lord, and Savior. May these gifts honor and glorify you!"


