

LENTEN REFLECTION

These days of social isolation have certainly put us on notice about the importance of Parish. In the past we may have taken for granted the chance to gather as the priestly people of God each week to give praise to God and ask God's help in our lives. For many of us "going to Church" has been our only time for being religious each week. Our own prayers have taken second place to the cleric leading us at Sunday Mass. Maybe the current drought of Mass is a good wake-up call for us to restore the most important resource of our own daily prayer!

"Where two or three gather in my name, there I am in their midst", is the promise of Christ to us. Yet do we let this promise inform our understanding of our family? We may be alert to this promise when we go to Church, but can it also inform us of the sacredness of our family, particularly our gathering for meals? In these days when we cannot gather in the church, we can still be Church for one another. As we restore this awareness of our faith to our attention, we can be laying the basis for a great development: to move us from a clerical centred community to one built on the foundation of the living faith of each of us. For it is on the foundations of that gift of our faith which each of us brings to Sunday Mass that we join with the presiding cleric to be the priestly people of God.

So in these days of social isolation let us take the opportunity to gather in prayer with our family at particular times during the day. For some this may be praying the Lord's Prayer together, naming the special needs of our family that day and the needs of all around us; we could pray the Rosary together; we could read a passage from Scripture to let God shine light upon our life. Over Holy Week the parish will be providing short prayer services for each day to focus our prayer for that day. These are intended to help you pray as a family.

Whatever way we do it let us strengthen each other by taking time each day to be the Body of Christ.

Gospel reading for this Week Easter Sunday - Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb,' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Gospel reading for Next Week Second Sunday of Easter - Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to

John 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them. 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:


'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord,' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
