

EXPLORE LIFE, FAITH & MEANING TRY ALPHA



<u>Mondays</u> from 6.30 to 8.30pm commencing Monday, 6 May (9 weeks)

Wednesdays at 1-2pm commencing Wednesday, 8 May

Please come and join us for a meal, a talk on aspects of Christian faith such as Who is Jesus? followed by a small group discussion.

Alpha helps promote a <u>culture of hospitality and</u> <u>invitation</u>, creating a space where everyone is welcome regardless of where they are on their faith journey. What is highlighted is a <u>personal</u> <u>encounter with Jesus</u>: people are introduced to Jesus and given the opportunity to respond to him.

In *Evangelii Gaudium* - the Joy of the Gospel -Pope Francis invites all of us to become missionary disciples. Alpha is a tool that both allows us to take up this challenge in our local communities and also creates an opportunity for people to meet Jesus - for the first time, or, to further strengthen their relationship with him.

A book to read in relation to making disciples - or what the author refers to as forming <u>intentional</u> <u>disciples</u> is by Sherry Weddell and called Forming Intentional Disciples: The Path to Knowing and Following Jesus. In this book Weddell writes that the way to be a disciple is simply to, like Simon Peter, drop our nets and follow Jesus. Alpha is one such program that provides a space to foster a friendship with Jesus and put him first.

What we found when we ran Alpha last year was that either new friendships were created or existing friendships deepened: in this, the hope would be that St Benedict's could truly become a community of friends - of each other and of Jesus where all feel they are welcome and that they belong.

Come and see what Alpha is about: a card is found at both entrances to the Church ~ invite family and friends.

Please also let us know if you are able to help in any way, in particular with meals.

Gospel reading for Next Week Easter Sunday Year C

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 20:1-9

The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
