SELF REFLECTION: Presence

In this Sunday's Gospel Luke 10:38-42, Jesus visits the home of Martha and Mary. While Martha is busy with all the preparations, Mary sits at Jesus' feet, listening to His words. Martha becomes frustrated and asks Jesus to tell Mary to help her. But Jesus gently reminds Martha that Mary has chosen what is better—being present with Him.

I ask myself:

- When I feel overwhelmed or busy, do I turn to Jesus or try to manage everything on my own?
- How often do I make time to sit in stillness and listen to God's word?
- In my daily life, what are the "distractions" that pull me away from what really matters?



Dístractíon Presence

Lord Jesus, In the busyness of my days, help me not to forget what truly matters. Teach me to be still, to sit at Your feet, and to listen to Your voice. Like Mary, may I choose the better part—time with You—over endless distractions. Calm my restless heart and draw me closer to You each day. Amen

First Reading: Gen 18:1-10
A reading from the book of Genesis
Lord, do not bypass your servant.

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My Lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree.

'Where is your wife Sarah?' he asked him. 'She is in the tent' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail, and your wife will then have a son.'

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians

The mystery hidden for centuries has now been revealed to his saints.

It makes me happy to suffer for you, as I am suffering now, and in my own body to do what I can to make up all that has still to be undergone by Christ for the sake of his body, the Church. I became the servant of the Church when God made me responsible for delivering God's message to you, the message which was a mystery hidden for generations and centuries and has now been revealed to his saints. It was God's purpose to reveal it to them and to show all the rich glory of this mystery to pagans. The mystery is Christ among you, your hope of glory: this is the Christ we proclaim, this is the wisdom in which we thoroughly train

everyone and instruct everyone, to make them all perfect in Christ.

Martha took up the duties in the house. Mary chose the better part.

Jesus came to a village, and a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. She had a sister called Mary, who sat down at the Lord's feet and listened to him speaking. Now Martha who was distracted with all the serving said, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister is leaving me to do the serving all by myself? Please tell her to help me.' But the Lord answered: 'Martha, Martha,' he said, 'you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one. It is Mary who has chosen the better part; it is not to be taken from her.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Genesis 18:1-10/ Psalm 14:2-5/ Colossians 1:24-28 / Luke 10:38-42

The Lord appeared to Abraham. (Genesis 18:1)

Isn't it mysterious? Genesis 18:1 tells us that "the Lord appeared to Abraham." But then Abraham sees "three men" (18:2). The visitors are later identified as angels, but one seems to be the Lord himself (18:20-22). It's hard to know exactly what Abraham saw and at what point he realiSed that he was in the presence of Almighty God.

Here's another mystery: this same Lord will be with everyone gathered at every Mass today. We will hear his voice in the readings and see him in the Host and Chalice. So let's take a look at how Abraham responded to God's presence to see how we can respond to him today.

First, Abraham gave God his full attention. He stopped what he was doing and "ran" to meet him (Genesis 18:2). As Mass begins, you can imitate Abraham as you try to put aside any distractions and be attentive to the Lord. Next, he bowed down(Genesis 18:2). While this might have been a traditional greeting, it also showed that Abraham recogniSed his visitors' dignity. Imagine yourself bowing low as you pray the Gloria and praise God in the responsorial psalm. Then, Abraham offered to God the best he had—fine flour and a choice steer (Genesis 18:6-7). When the gifts are brought to the altar, you can offer your life to the Lord. Give him your love and fidelity. Finally, Abraham waited on his guests(Genesis 18:8). That's something you can do after Holy Communion, as you pray quietly in adoration. Enjoy your time with the Lord and listen to him. So remember Abraham when you come into God's mysterious, surprising presence today. Let the promise of his love fill your heart with reverence. Generously offer him your attention, your worship, the best of who you are. As you do, you'll come to see him more and more clearly. Just like Abraham.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saints Joachim and Anne - Memorial

Feast Day: July 26
Late First Century B.C.—Early First Century A.D.

Saint Anne—Patron Saint of grandparents, grandmothers, mothers, roommakers, cabinetmakers, carpenters, dressmakers equestrians, expectant mothers, homemakers, housewives, lace workers, seamstresses, miners, old-clothes dealers, Canada, and France Invoked against sterility and poverty and to find lost articles

Saint Joachim—Patron Saint of grandparents, grandfathers, fathers, married couples, cabinetmakers, and linen traders

Pre-Congregation canonization

Today we honor the Blessed Virgin Mary's parents and Jesus' grandparents. Their names are not recorded in the Gospels but come from a mid-second-century apocryphal document, the Gospel of James. Though this "gospel" has been deemed inauthentic, it is the earliest record of the Blessed Mother's parents. We can at least presume that the names Joachim and Anne are correct. Other apocryphal literature also contains uncertain information about these holy parents and grandparents.

According to tradition, Joachim was a wealthy and generous man. He and his wife, Anne, were advanced in years and childless. One day, Joachim arrived at the Temple to make an offering that Rubim, most likely a Levitical priest, rejected because Joachim was childless, which was understood as a sign of God's disfavor. Distressed, Joachim left the Temple and studied the Scriptures to see if he could find anyone of importance who was childless. When he came upon Abraham, he recalled that Abraham was only given a child in his old age. Rather than returning home, Joachim embarked on a forty-day period of fasting and prayer in the desert, beseeching God for a child. Anne also prayed, asking God for a child. An angel appeared to both Joachim and Anne, promising that the couple would conceive a child. Nine months later, Anne bore a daughter whom the couple named Mary. Because of a vow they had made, Joachim and Anne brought three-year-old Mary to the Temple where she lived until it was time for her to be married. She was educated by the priests and holy women and spent her days in prayer and union with God.

The Presentation of Mary in the Temple is a liturgical feast celebrated in the Eastern Church as early as the sixth century and in the Western Church in the eleventh century, giving credence to a lived faith and liturgical acceptance of her presentation by her parents. In the old city of Jerusalem, an ancient church still stands next to the Temple Mount in which it is believed that the Blessed Virgin Mary was born and might have lived during her early days after being presented in the Temple.

As early as the sixth century, churches were built in Saint Anne's honor, prayers were offered for her intercession, devotions were formulated, and patronages were attributed to her. In the sixteenth century, devotion to Saint Joachim's feast day was placed on the General Roman Calendar.

Regardless of the veracity of the legends about Saints Joachim and Anne, we know that the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Immaculate Conception, had parents. They loved her, raised her, and offered her to God. Today the faithful seek their intercession as Saints Joachim and Anne. They are especially called upon for their intercession for grandparents. On a spiritual level, just as the Blessed Virgin is our mother, so also are Saints Joachim and Anne our grandparents in the order of grace.

Saints Joachim and Anne, you were given the incredible privilege and responsibility to give birth to and raise the Immaculate Conception, the Mother of God. Her presence in your lives left you in awe of God's grace. Please pray that I may love your daughter and your Grandson with the same love you bore for each of them, so that I will enjoy their company with you in Heaven one day.

Saints Joachim and Anne, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.




