

SELF-REFLECTION: SPIRITUAL RENEWAL

John 2:13–22 – Jesus Cleanses the Temple

When Jesus cleanses the Temple, He reminds us that God's house is meant to be a place of prayer. In the same way, our hearts are meant to be a place where God dwells. Yet life can easily fill our hearts with noise, worries, or habits that distract us from Him. Jesus does not act out of anger, but out of love — He wants to restore our hearts so that we can experience peace and closeness with God.

I reflect:

- 1. What "noise" or distractions might be filling my heart at this moment?
- 2. Are there habits or attitudes I need to let go of so I can draw closer to God?
- 3. Do I treat my church, my home, and my heart as places of prayer?
- 4. When I come to Mass, do I make time to prepare my heart to meet Jesus?
- 5. What is one small change I can make this week to create more space for God?

Praver

Lord Jesus, cleanse my heart and make it a place where You can dwell. Remove anything that keeps me away from You. Fill me with Your peace, Your love, and Your presence. Amen.

First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I see water flowing from the temple and all who were touched by it were saved.

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side. He said, 'This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.'



The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm: The waters of the river gladden the city of God.

Second Reading: *1 Corinthians 3:9-11, 16-17 (JB)*A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians *You are the temple of God*


You are God's building. By the grace God gave me, I succeeded as an architect and laid the foundations, on which someone else is doing the building. Everyone doing the building must work carefully. For the foundation, nobody can lay any other than the one which has already been laid, that is Jesus Christ.

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! I have chosen and sanctified this house, says the Lord, that my name may remain in it for all time. Alleluia!



GOSPEL John 2:13-22 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John He spoke about the temple of his own body.

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market'. Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up'. The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Readings: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12 | Psalm 45 | 1 Cor 3:9-11, 16-17 | John 2:13-22

In the first reading from Ezekiel, we see a river flowing from the Temple — a river that brings life wherever it goes. This is a powerful image of God's grace: when His presence dwells among His people, life, healing, and renewal follow.

St Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians that we are now the Temple of God. God's Spirit dwells not in a building of stone, but in the hearts of His people. We carry His presence into the world.

In the Gospel, Jesus cleanses the Temple in Jerusalem. His righteous anger is not about rules, but about love — the Temple had lost its purpose as a place of prayer and encounter with God. Jesus wants the house of God to remain holy... and because we are God's dwelling place, He also calls us to let Him cleanse our hearts. He wants to remove whatever crowds out His presence — distractions, resentments, unhealthy habits, or anything that keeps us from peace.

The message today is clear:

God wants to live within us — and when He does, His life flows out from us to others.

Key Thought:

My heart is God's dwelling place. When I make room for Him, His life flows into the world through me.

Take-Home Challenge:

Choose one small area of your life to "cleanse" this week — perhaps a habit, a distraction, or a worry — and intentionally make space for quiet prayer each day, even just 5 minutes.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, cleanse my heart and make it Your home. Let Your Spirit live in me and flow through me. Bring Your peace, Your healing, and Your life to all I meet. Amen.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA, ROME

Feast Day: November 9

The most important temple is that of a person's soul. In the secret center of our being is the sacred sanctuary where we meet God. In addition to the temple of the soul are other sacred places—shrines, churches, basilicas, grottos, and cathedrals set aside for the worship of God. They are to be a Heaven on earth, a place where we join the Seraphim, Cherubim, and Thrones in their angelic praises of the Most Holy Trinity. Today's feast commemorates one such place.

Rome is home to four major basilicas. The first three are Saint Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls, and the Basilica of Saint Mary Major. The fourth is the Archbasilica Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran, also called Saint John Lateran, or the Lateran Basilica for short. Of the four major basilicas, Saint John Lateran is the oldest and most important. Though the pope lives next to Saint Peter's Basilica, Saint John Lateran is the official cathedral of Rome. Saint John Lateran is the mother church of the Archdiocese of Rome and the mother church of the entire world.

In AD 64, Roman Emperor Nero blamed a devastating fire in Rome on the Christians. In retaliation, he ordered the execution of many Christians, including Saints Peter and Paul. In 65, Counsel-designate Plautius Lateranus (Lateran) was part of a conspiracy to kill Nero. When Nero learned of the plot, he beheaded Lateranus and confiscated his home, the Lateran Palace. Over the next 250 years, Roman emperors used the palace in various ways. In 312, Constantine the Great became the sole ruler of the Western Roman Empire and took possession of the Lateran Palace. In 313, after issuing the Edict of Milan with Eastern Emperor Licinius, Constantine donated the Lateran Palace to Pope Miltiades who first used it for a synod of bishops before constructing the first Basilica in Rome. Upon its completion in the year 324, it was dedicated by Pope Sylvester and given the name the "House of God," with a special designation to Christ the Savior.

Constantine the Great greatly helped the Catholic Church flourish after legalizing its practice. He had the Lateran Basilica beautifully decorated with gold and silver. He built churches in Rome, Jerusalem, Bethlehem, and Constantinople. After centuries of persecution, the Church had its first cathedral in the heart of Rome, beautifully decorated, with the Roman emperor's full support.

Though the basilica was dedicated to Christ the Savior, in the tenth century Pope Sergius III added a new baptistry and rededicated the basilica to Saint John the Baptist. In the twelfth century, Pope Lucius II dedicated the basilica to Saint John the Evangelist. Today, the basilica honors Christ the Savior first and the two Saint Johns as the copatrons.

The Lateran Basilica has remained the pope's cathedral from the time of its dedication, and the Lateran Palace, next to the Basilica, was the papal residence from 324–1305. In 1305, Pope Clement V refused to move to Rome after his election, moving the entire papal court to Avignon, France in 1309, where it remained until Pope Gregory XI returned to Rome in 1377. By then, the Lateran Palace was in disrepair due to two fires. The pope built a new palace next to Saint Peter's on Vatican Hill, where every subsequent pope has resided until today.

Christ our Savior, through the intercessions of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist, I pray for the Church. I pray for your abundant mercy upon every sinner whom you are calling for reconciliation. I pray for my local parish, diocese, country, and the Universal Church headed in Rome. I especially pray for the Holy Father, the pastor of the Lateran Basilica and shepherd of the whole Church. Draw him close to You, make him holy, and use him to draw many people to Yourself. Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist, pray for us. Jesus I trust in You.


