SELF-REFLECTION: HUMILITY

"God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

This Sunday's Gospel, Luke 18:9-14, Jesus reminds us that true prayer comes from a humble heart. The Pharisee boasted of his goodness, but the tax collector simply asked for mercy — and it was he who went home right with God.

Let us pray with humility, not pride, trusting in God's mercy rather than our own goodness.

Reflect:

- · Do I pray with humility or self-righteousness?
- Do I compare myself with others?
- When have I truly felt my need for God's mercy?
- How can I grow in humility this week?
- What helps me be honest with God in prayer?

Lord Jesus, teach me to pray with a humble heart. Be merciful to me, a sinner, and fill me with Your peace. Amen.

First Reading: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-19 (JB)

A reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus

The prayer of the humble will penetrate the heavens.

The Lord is a judge

who is no respecter of personages.

He shows no respect of personages to the detriment of a poor man,

he listens to the plea of the injured party.

He does not ignore the orphan's supplication,

nor the widow's as she pours out her story.

The man who with his whole heart serves God will be accepted, his petitions will carry to the clouds.

The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds,

until it arrives he is inconsolable,

nor will he desist until the Most High takes notice of him,

acquits the virtuous and delivers judgement.

nor will he be dilatory on their behalf.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18 (JB)

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy

All that remains is the crown of righteousness reserved for me.

My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing.

The first time I had to present my defence, there was not a single witness to support me. Every one of them deserted me - may they not be held accountable for it. But the Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the

lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

GOSPEL Luke 18:9-14 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The publican returned to his home justified; the pharisee did not.

"For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted."

~Luke 18:14

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Readings: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-19 / Psalm 33 / 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18 / Luke 18:9-14

In today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts two men at prayer — one proud, the other humble. The Pharisee praises himself, while the tax collector quietly asks for mercy. Jesus teaches that it is the humble heart, aware of its need for God, that is truly justified.

Sirach reminds us that God listens not to appearances but to sincerity; He hears the cry of the poor and the oppressed. St Paul, in his letter to Timothy, speaks with confidence and humility about having "fought the good fight," knowing that his strength came from the Lord.

Together, these readings remind us that God values authenticity, humility, and trust more than words or status.

Key Thought:

God hears the humble heart. True prayer is not about what we say, but how honestly we open ourselves before Him

Take-Home Challenge:

This week, pray the simple words of the tax collector:

"God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Say it slowly, with honesty — especially when pride or comparison creeps in.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, teach me to come before You with a humble and grateful heart. When I am tempted to judge or boast, remind me that all I have is gift. May my life reflect Your mercy and love. Amen.

CATECHISTS' NEWS

The Spirituality of the Catechist' by Michael Tebbutt continues Missionary Zeal. "As a catechist, would you describe yourself as enthusiastic? Does our body language match the joy of the Gospel that we are proclaiming or do we enter the classroom as if we have just attended a funeral?

From Pope Paul VI's encyclical <u>Evangelii Nuntiandi</u> (On Evangelization in Our Times) we read: 'Here lies the test of truth, the touchstone of evangelization: it is unthinkable that a person should accept the Word and give himself to the kingdom without becoming a person who bears witness to it and proclaims it in his turn'(24). As catechists, we must radiate the Good News of the Gospel to be effective catechists.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

ALL SAINTS DAY

Feast Day: November 1

The Solemnity of All Saints honors all men and women who have entered Heaven, but we particularly focus on those who led extraordinarily holy lives and whom the Church has canonized as saints. They honored God in various ways: through deep prayer and mystical union, through martyrdom or persecution, or through service, such as caring for the needy. The saints include powerful preachers, miracle workers, and leaders, while others lived in obscurity or exile.

By honoring the saints, we honor and glorify God Who made them holy. Heaven will be the eternal glory of God through the lives of His saints. In Heaven, the saints' virtues, sacrifices, prayers, and service will eternally manifest God's mercy and goodness. Every saint in Heaven will join a continuous chorus of angelic praise and worship of God. With the Seraphim, Cherubim, and Thrones, the saints will cry "Holy, Holy, Holy..." With the Dominions, Virtues, and Powers, the saints will participate in God's providential care of the New Heavens and Earth. With the Principalities, Archangels, and Guardian Angels, the saints will celebrate God's protection and continuous communication with His sons and daughters. Heaven today, and the New Heavens and Earth at the end of time, will be a continuous solemn celebration of God in His essence and of all that He has done in the lives of those who responded to His grace.

Honoring the saints is an invitation to each of us to strive for the holiness the saints attained. The saints' lives are a "how to" book in holiness. We study and ponder the lives of the "super saints"—such as the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saints Francis of Assisi, Catherine of Siena, Teresa of Ávila, Thérèse of Lisieux, Augustine of Hippo, and Thomas Aquinas—to learn from their examples. From Heaven, the saints are our powerful intercessors. God uses the saints and angels to mediate His grace. We rely upon their intercession as an act of faith by which we profess our belief in God.

Today's solemnity has its roots in the earliest days of the Church. Even in New Testament times, the community of believers honored martyrs, beginning with the deacon Saint Stephen. More martyrs followed, as the Church suffered persecution under the Roman emperors from AD 64 through 311.

After Emperor Constantine I legalized Christianity in 313, public devotion to the martyrs flourished, their graves becoming churches and places of pilgrimage and prayer. On May 13, 609, Pope Boniface IV transformed the Roman Pantheon, a pagan temple, into a church dedicated to the Blessed Virgin and all martyrs. On November 1, 731, Pope Gregory III dedicated an oratory within Saint Peter's Basilica to "all saints," including the Apostles, martyrs, confessors, and all holy men and women, broadening commemoration of the saints to all who lived saintly lives. In 844, Pope Gregory IV extended the November 1 celebration to the entire Church. In 1484, Pope Sixtus IV made November 1 a holy day of obligation, adding a vigil day and octave to make the celebration nine days in all. The vigil for All Hallows' Day was called All Hallows' Eve, or Halloween, which has unfortunately lost its saintly focus and has become a secular, and even pagan, celebration.

All saints in Heaven, I thank you for the holy witness you each have given to the Church and rejoice in the blessings you now enjoy in Heaven. Please pray that all people will become holy, bearing witness to Christ with our lives, and will one day enter Heaven. May God pour forth an abundance of grace upon the world through the example you set and the prayers you now pray before His throne. All saints of God, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You.
