- St. Edward's College



# Vision, Mission & Values

### 1910

Our Lady of the Rosary School opened in Gosford

### 1959

Our Lady of the Rosary School closed moving to current St. Patrick's site

### 1961

St. Francis of Assisi Church opened in Kulpura

### 1965

Our Lady of the Rosary Church closed, Parish Centre moves to St. Patrick's Fast Gosford

### 1986

Diocese of Broken Bay established

### 1999

St. Francis of Assisi Church closed, community moves to new chapel in Somersby

### 2003

Gosford Parish is placed under the pastoral care of the Society of the Divine Saviour (Salvatorians)





In 2003, Gosford Parish was placed under the pastoral care of the Salvatorian Order

The Society was founded in Rome, 8 December 1881 by Fr. Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan





Blessed Mary of the Apostles, co-foundress of the Sisters of the Divine Saviour, was beatified in 1967

Fr. Francis Jordan will be beatified on 15 May 2021





The Salvatorian Family has three branches: Salvatorian Fathers and Brothers Salvatorian Sisters Lay Salvatorians

Salvatorians arrived in Australia in 1961



Fr. Francis Jordan gave us the command and the mission to not rest content until all people know, love, and serve Jesus Christ as their Saviour

To reveal God's merciful love, Christ often healed and forgave the sins of His faithful followers. The power and authority of this incredible gift of grace has been given to us through the Sacraments of Healing. If you feel you are in need of God's merciful love and healing power, you are welcome to meet with one of our priests during Reconciliation times before mass, or making an appointment through the parish office. Our priests can also offer the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick for people who are ill, have a serious diagnosis, are awaiting surgery or have diminished health through advanced age.

Please refrain from smoking on church grounds Don't forget to silence or turn off your phones while in the church building






Please refrain from eating inside the church building

Before mass, and during dedicated prayer times, please be respectful of those in quiet prayer


