Pope Francis: 'Celebrate Christmas with people of Ukraine in our hearts'

Pope Francis has called on everyone to "renew our closeness to the battered Ukrainian people" and to persevere in "prayer for these our brothers and sisters who are suffering so much."

The Pope emphasized that we must keep them in our hearts and thoughts, especially as we draw near to celebrations for Christmas and intensify our spiritual preparation.

He suggested we celebrate "a humbler Christmas" and gift exchange and send what we have saved to help Ukrainians who desperately need assistance due to the extreme cold, illness, lack of doctors and medical facilities, and hunger now. We invite parishioners to bring their Baby Jesus figurines to any Christmas Mass to be blessed. Like the shepherds of long ago, we are invited to recognize the fulfilment of God's promises for all human beings in the baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.
