November 8 & 9 - Candle Sunday

Each person will receive a candle. After Communion, we will light our candles and pray for our departed loved ones. After each Mass, join us for tea and fellowship.

November 14 – Friday

6:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross — praying for our deceased loved ones.

November 15 – Saturday

10:00 a.m. Reflection and sharing on the *Life of St. Carlo Acutis*

November 15 & 16 – Sharing Food Sunday

Write the names of your deceased loved ones and place them in the basket. After each Mass, we will share a meal in their memory.

Bring a dish your loved ones enjoyed, and together we will celebrate their lives with gratitude.

November 22 & 23 – Feast of Christ the King (White Sunday)

Wear something white as a sign of resurrection and hope. We believe our beloved departed are with God, praying for us.

A votive candle stand will be placed near the working sacristy, light a candle in their honour and pray three Hail Marys for their eternal rest.

May this month be a time of prayer, remembrance, and thanksgiving, as we commend all our faithful departed into the loving mercy of God.
