World Day of Migrants and Refugees— Sunday 24 September

Today we acknowledge the World Day of Refugees and Migrants. Over 7.6 million migrants are living in Australia, with 29.8% of the population being born overseas. This year, Pope Francis calls us to reflect on the freedom to migrate, to stay at home or to return home. Everyone wants to be safe, healthy and happy, but some need to choose what will be the best place for their family to thrive.

As Christians, we hope that everyone is free to choose what is best for their life and wellbeing. As a community, we can choose not to judge, but to respond with the generosity of God. We can create spaces of human dignity and flourishing. We can provide welcome, hospitality and means to earn an income. We can show love and build pathways towards hope and healing. We can support those who choose to return. Pope Francis says that “the chance to live in peace and with dignity” is not yet a right, but “must be seen as a shared responsibility”. Our communities are free to choose how to respond. Will our actions show that God's greatness cannot be measured?

Jesus identifies Himself as a stranger to be welcomed (Matthew 25:35). The Catholic Church teaches that Christ has in some way united himself to every person. Christ will consider done to himself the kind of treatment that is reserved to any human person, in particular, to the least among them, the stranger.

God our Lord, keep us by the power of your Spirit so that we can share your tender love to every migrant whom you place in our path, and to spread in hearts and everywhere the way of love and of care. Amen.

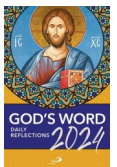
4 October: Blessing of the Animals
