

Easter greetings to you all.

If you remember towards the end of last year, we went through a challenging time with the power outage in the church. Investigating and rectifying the matter took a significant amount of time and effort, and it came at great cost (we were using 5 aircons to full capacity on two circuits). The rectification process has taken time and the cost factor was a great concern, Patience is a virtue, and the good Lord, through his Mother, has guided us through this journey, with the help of great men.

A major upgrade to the electricity system in the church has been carried on. The new lights are not only more efficient but also cost-effective, significantly reducing the power consumption from 11.5 amps to just 5 amps per use. This upgrade not only enhances the functionality and safety of the church but also demonstrates a commitment to sustainability and responsible energy usage.

Thanks to the generosity of the donor who stepped forward to cover the costs associated with the upgrade. Their kindness and support have undoubtedly made a significant difference in the repair process. Additionally, the electrician's dedication and willingness to support the church at a reasonable price speak volumes about their commitment to service. It's through the collaboration and support of individuals like these that communities can overcome challenges and thrive. Their expertise, attention to detail, and dedication to ensuring the safety and efficiency of the electrical system deserve recognition and appreciation. It's through their hard work and commitment that the church can now operate smoothly and safely.
