In Fr David's Absence

I read a terrific book the other day entitled 'Shadows and the Dark'. It is by Australian Jesuit Fr John Cowburn who is Professor of Philosophy at Jesuit Theological College, Melbourne. This book explores how we can hold to a loving God in the face of evil.

The idea for the book came when Fr John fell from his bicycle, broke his collarbone and was awaiting surgery in hospital. While there, an old religious sister came to his room to give him Holy Communion before going to the operating theatre. Fr John told her about the accident. Sister said, 'Well Father, God must have known you needed a little holiday, so he arranged for your fall'. John replied, 'If that's true Sister I'm pleased God didn't want me to take a sabbatical!' From Jesus' day to ours, when bad things happen to good people it seems easier to blame God or Satan. By his own admission Fr John had an accident because he didn't take enough care on his bike. End of story. That God can bring something good out of such an accident is grace building on nature. What Jesus confronts in today's Gospel is 'The-devil-made-me-do-it' theology. And his response is as challenging now as it was in first century Palestine.

For as long as we blame our most destructive behaviour on evil acting upon us in all its guises, empty promises and powers, then we remain some way from taking the sort of responsibility for the condition of our hearts that might see them fully converted by Christ's saving love. This is not to say that evil does not exist or that it cannot have a powerful effect upon us, quite the opposite. Just as grace builds on love and goodness, evil grows out of estrangement and hatred. As Christians we hold that God has given us free will, and evil's hold on our hearts is often the result of the poor choices and smaller compromises we have made along the way.

The way we look at the evil in our lives and the world also affects our compassion. For if we're not in touch with the greed that leads to theft, the anger that leads to murder, the desire for power that leads to rape, or the alienation that leads to terrorism, then it's hard for us to be compassionate toward the perpetrators of these evil acts. The degree to which we know what our hearts are capable of leads us to be grateful for the graces we receive and cultivate, and to be compassionate toward those who have missed out on this good news and who, by nurture or free will, have chosen evil as their fundamental option.

May this Eucharist enable us to take in the broken body of Christ because we know we are a broken people in need of its power, and as Christ's blood is poured for us, may we be poured out in love, so that, through us, others might hear His call to a conversion of heart.

Plenary Council 2020

Pope Francis has given his formal approval for the Catholic Church in Australia to hold a Plenary Council in 2020.

The Plenary Council 2020 is a gathering of the Church in Australia to make decisions for the future. **Your** voice is important.

Preparation for the Plenary Council 2020 begins with open Listening and Dialogue.

We are responding to the question "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"

Your experience of faith and the Church is important. You can respond as an individual or by joining some of the group sessions, that will be held over the rest of 2018.

What is exciting about this journey is that anyone in the community whether part of the Catholic faith or not, can respond. In September we are going to start with three Plenary evening meetings. We invite you to join us for evenings of engagement and rich dialogue.

First Plenary meeting 13th September will be hosted by special guest John Cleary

John Cleary is a veteran ABC broadcaster and one of Australia's best-known commentators on religion.

In his 30-year career with the ABC he has worked extensively in both radio and television, but is known principally for his association with Sunday Nights on ABC Local Radio and The Religion Report on ABC Radio National. John began his career in Perth, where he was one of the original Compass team on ABC TV and a co-presenter of the philosophy program, Meridian, on Radio National in the 1990s. For several years, John also appeared in a regular slot on the ABC youth network JJJ. His 1992 book on the Salvation Army in Australia was awarded the Christian Book of the Year.

In 2008, John was host of the interfaith event held by the Catholic Church in conjunction with World Youth Day and the visit of Pope Benedict XVI.

From Fr David



My time away from you is drawing to its close, and I am looking forward to being back with you from the 10th September. My proposed 'sabbatical' has turned out very different from what I had planned, and I will return to you with the additional role as Diocesan Administrator whilst we wait in anticipation for the Holy Father to appoint us a new Bishop. As you are aware, I received the appointment as Diocesan Administrator on 3 August. The time since then has been busy as I have organised the office, met with the many leaders of the Diocese, attended a number of different diocesan events, and worked through a range of different issues. The life of a Diocese is complex and diverse. However, it is also energetic and exciting! In the midst of this I have also been able to participate in several conferences and seminars. This all may sound tiring, but the last couple of months have been allowed for quality breaks, and therefore they have been restful.

Once again, I express my deepest gratitude to our marvellous Jackie Thornton, our Parish Secretary, for all her work in my absence, and to our wonderful Carmelite Fathers from St Ives, along with Deacon Adrian, who have ensured that the sacramental life of our community continue uninterrupted. I am also very grateful to the members of our Parish Pastoral Council who have taken up the leadership in regard to our community's contribution to the processes of the Australian Plenary Council in 2020. They have kept me briefed on their plans which I fully support and look forward to contributing when I have returned. I take this opportunity, too, to express publicly my sincere condolences to Ken Laing, the Chair of our PPC, whose mother, Betty, sadly has recently passed away.

Given the unexpected developments since I took leave of our Parish, I have needed now to put into place some arrangements to assist me in the exercise of my dual roles. Might I share these with you?

Firstly, I remain Parish Priest for you, but during the week I will need to be present in the Diocesan office for most of the time, namely from Tuesday midday to Friday midday. However, thankfully, I will be able to be present in the Parish on most weekends, and for the evening meetings of our Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Finance Committee, and so forth, during the week. There will only be some weekends where I will need to be away for diocesan purposes.

Secondly, to assist us in the pastoral care of the community, I have appointed **Fr Anselm Lakra as our Assistant Priest**, effective 17 September. Fr Anselm has recently assisted at the Cathedral Parish of Hornsby, and prior to that he has been Assistant Priest at Epping-Carlingford Parish. He is a member of the Religious institute known as the Heralds of the Good News, and originally hails from Kerala, in India. He is a delightful and gentle man, and I am sure that you welcome him warmly. Fr Anselm will minister to the pastoral life of the parish especially during the week: celebrating daily Mass, attending to sick calls and the hospitals, celebrating funerals, visiting our schools and our aged care facilities.

Thirdly, Deacon Adrian Gomez, appointed to our Parish by Bishop Peter, will continue in his service to us of a weekend through his diaconal ministry, assisting at our Masses, preaching and celebrating some of our baptisms. We will continue to maintain Monday as a day on which both Fr Anselm and myself enjoy as day of rest.

And so, as we go forward, we will have a very rich team of clergy, indeed, nourishing the life our parish community!

Please continue to keep me in your heart and prayer, as I do you, and I look forward to seeing you all again very soon.

- safeTALK stands for suicide awareness for everyone
- Talk Ask Listen Keepsafe, with the emphasis on awareness this is a training in the *awareness* of suicide and not *Intervention* in suicide, which means no prior knowledge is required
- it is a 3 hour presentation with a 20 minute interval
- it involves power point slides with several video clips and there is interaction with the participants
- the cost is \$30 per person
- everyone who attends the full course will receive a certificate
- no one under 15 years is allowed to attend
- it is not recommended for people recently bereaved by suicide
- A minimum of 10 and a maximum of 40 participants is required
