WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY 6 May 2018 A Message from Bishop Peter A Comensoli

In his annual Message for World Communications Day, Pope Francis says, that communication is part of God's plan for us - an essential way to experience fellowship.

But, in this age of fast and furious media it can be difficult to know who and what we can trust. News, Social Media, Movies, Videos, Celebrities, Art, Music and more fill our lives with conflicting stories and realities.

Carefully discerning authentic communications, and being authentic communicators ourselves can be a minefield we need to negotiate carefully...and slowly.

It can be all too easy to place the responsibility for 'good' news solely on journalists and media organisations, when in fact we too share in the ownership of information by how we receive and share it.

As Pope Francis says in his Message, we need to be 'people who are not greedy but ready to listen, people who make the effort to engage in sincere dialogue so that the truth can emerge; people who are attracted by goodness and take responsibility for how they use language.'

And at all times, we need to be the voice of Christ.

In the words of St Francis of Assisi:
Lord, make us instruments of your peace.

A Request from James and Jo Toomey

In June, Jo and I will be trekking 60km of the Larapinta Trail near Alice Springs to raise funds to launch a new urgently needed Mission Australia service in the Northern Territory called Missionbeat. Missionbeat NT will be a life-saving mobile outreach and support service for young people experiencing homelessness or in need of assistance. You may be aware that Australia's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people endure disproportionate levels of homelessness and disadvantage, and I believe Missionbeat NT has an important role to play in addressing these issues. You may not be aware that the NT has the highest rate of homelessness in Australia. As the CEO of Mission Australia, I've seen firsthand the impact Missionbeat has already made in Sydney, Brisbane, Perth and Tasmania, and I know its expansion to the NT will make a significant positive impact. Missionbeat staff aim to meet people's immediate needs, providing food, clothing, medical care and links to safe accommodation where possible. They also work in close collaboration with other organisations to help break the cycle of homelessness for individuals and families. That's why I'm taking on this challenge – alongside my wife Jo and a number of other enthusiastic Mission Australia supporters – and why I'm asking for your help. I would be so grateful if you could support me and Jo with a donation. Every dollar you give will go directly towards launching Missionbeat in the NT as Jo and I have already covered the expenses associated with the trip. Your donation will be an investment into the lives and futures of vulnerable young Australians in desperate need.

Thank you for your support as Jo and I prepare to raise funds for a cause that's so core to my work at Mission Australia and very close to my heart. James Toomey

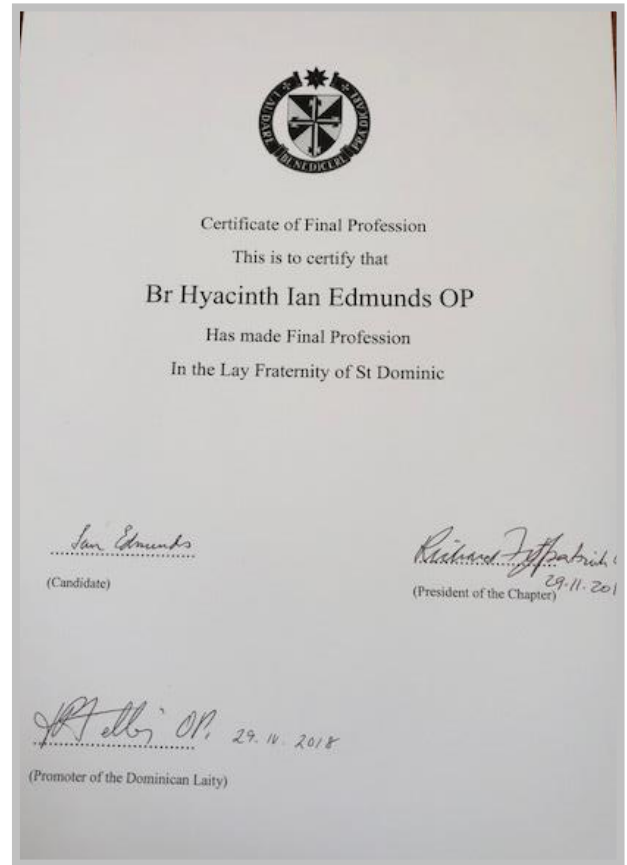
