



1 March 2026 - SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Journey of faith and the call of God

Dear friends,

This second Sunday of Lent invites us to explore two powerful biblical events: the call of Abraham and the transfiguration of Jesus Christ. These events illuminate our understanding about faith and our conversion during this sacred season of Lent.

From the First Reading, we have a call to learn to trust God. God speaks directly to Abram, calling him to leave his homeland, his people and his father's household. This call is not just geographical, it is deeply spiritual. Abram is invited to trust in God's promise: "I will make you a great nation", says the Lord to him.

This call emphasises the fact that Christian faith requires leaving behind the familiar to embrace the divine plan. Abram's response is immediate and profound. This is a model of faith that relies not on visible certainties but on trusting in God's unfailing guidance.

Like Abram, we are often taken out of our comfort zones. Whether it's letting go of old habits, confronting fear or stepping into new roles in our community, the challenge remains the same: to trust in God's plan even when our path ahead is obscured by uncertainty.

This Lenten season is a perfect opportunity for us to reflect on our responses to God's call in our lives. The question is, what is God inviting me personally to leave behind to fully embrace a life of faith?

Faith is not a destination but a pilgrimage of continual growth and discovery of the mystery of the divine. In today's Gospel, Peter, John and James experienced this continual growth and discovery during the transfiguration of Christ.

This stands as a powerful affirmation of His divine identity and mission. As we continue our Lenten pilgrimage, we are encouraged, like the disciples, to seek the divine presence in the midst of our daily struggles.

Easter is an 8 day celebration leading to Easter Season, which ends on Pentecost.



What Is Lent?

Lent is a time of spiritual preparation, self-examination, and penance leading up to the celebration of Easter.

Catholics use this time to imitate Jesus' forty days of fasting in the desert.

It is an opportunity for us to deepen our relationship with God, seek forgiveness for sins, and grow in spiritual discipline. Catholics focus on self-denial, prayerful reflection, and charitable acts as a means of drawing closer to God.

Fasting (Age 18–59): Obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. It involves limiting food intake to one full meal and two smaller meals, with no eating in between.

Abstinence (Age 14+): Obligatory on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. It forbids eating meat (beef, pork, chicken), but fish, dairy, eggs, and condiments made from animal fat are permitted.

Purpose: These practices serve as acts of reparation for sins, turning away from selfish desires, and fostering a spirit of prayer and sacrifice.

Exceptions: People with health conditions, pregnant or nursing women, or those unable to fast for medical reasons are exempt from the strict rules.
