Australian Plenary Council 2020
"Listen to what the Spirit is Saying"

Pope Francis has approved the Australian Bishops' request to hold a Plenary Council in Australia in 2020 and 2021. It is a significant moment for the Church in Australia to make decisions about the future. To prepare the agenda for the Plenary Council, all of God's people are invited to reflect on the question: "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"

Each Parish in the Diocese is to choose some local animators who might assist in the facilitation of this process. Our Parish Pastoral Council has recommended four parishioners to be trained in early August for this task. We will introduce them to our community in the coming weeks. Through September and October we will create listening circles for people to come together to share and reflect. This will lead into some diocesan regional meetings at which Bishop Peter will listen and reflect.

Dear friends,
 Sadly, in the last few days we have had news of several families suffering the pain of miscarriages. Throughout this week, the clergy of our Diocese will gather with Bishop Peter at St Joseph's Conference Centre at Baulkham Hills for their annual Clergy Conference which begins Monday evening and concludes on Thursday evening. This year we will be joined by Cardinal Charles Bo, Archbishop of Yangon, Myanmar who will introduce us to the Church at the peripheries, and by Dr Carlos Raimundo, Clinical Director of Canisius Spirituality Centre who will lead us on the theme of Pastoral Accompaniment of Priestly Ministry. Each afternoon there will also be the opportunity for workshops to discuss some more practical matters in regard to our diocesan life and parish leadership. Do keep us all in your prayer during this important time of being together. **Given the Conference, there will be no Mass celebrated in our church on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday. However, a Liturgy of the Word with Communion will be celebrated.**

You will notice that the entrances to the church are looking very shiny! Over this last week we have had them repaired for cracks in the timber panels, sanded and re-sealed. Given the weathering that have suffered, this renovation as been most welcome. With the painters here, we also have managed to re-paint the Priory Dining Room. And you cannot but notice the very elegant liturgical banners on the Sanctuary! A special thanks to Paul Sutherland for facilitating and hanging these. We will now gather a wardrobe of different liturgical colours in this style for the seasons ahead.

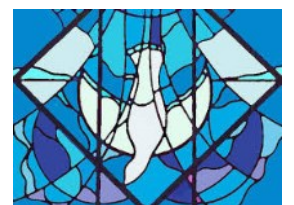

Working in a child-related ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay: Paid and volunteer workers who have direct face to face contact with children (under 18 years) are required by law to obtain a Working with Children Check number. Please note though, exemptions may apply in some cases. The Parish is the employer of the paid or volunteer worker and therefore is required by law to verify the Working with Children Check number. All paid or volunteer workers engaged in a child-related role must have a clear Working with Children Check to work in a child-related ministry. This disclosure references the legislation, Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012.

Children's Liturgy of The Word

Is held on Sundays at Holy Name during the 9.15am Mass, uses aspects of the 'Lectio Divina' approach to assist children of the parish to reflect on the Word of God. The weekly Gospel is translated into meaning for daily life and encourages the development of each child's individual faith and spirituality.

Children's Liturgy is held in the parish sunroom every Sunday at 9.15am Mass during school terms, with pre-school to school age children welcome to attend.

A dedicated group of volunteers assist with Children's Liturgy, with a commitment of one Sunday each school term. We are currently looking for new volunteers who would like to assist with this wonderful Holy Name Parish ministry as either a leader or assistant. Training and all materials are provided. A NSW Government 'Working With Children Check' (WWC) will be required and is completed 'online'. Please contact Jackie at the Parish Office for more information.

Two Important Community Announcements from Fr David

Appointment of Deacon Adrian Gomez to our Parish

I am very pleased to share with you that Bishop Peter has appointed Deacon Adrian Gomez as Deacon for our Parish, effective 7 June 2018. Deacon Adrian is a Permanent Deacon of the Diocese of Broken Bay. A Deacon is the First Order of Holy Orders. In Holy Orders there is the Order of Deacons, the Order of Priests and the Order of Bishops. A Deacon is ordained to a ministry of Word and Service. He assists in the Liturgy, proclaims the Gospel, preaches the Word of God, and undertakes a variety of services for the benefit of the community. He is also mandated by the Church to conduct Baptisms, and Weddings and Funerals that are outside the context of Mass. In our Church there are two types of Deacons: transitional Deacons and Permanent Deacons. Transitional Deacons are those ordained as preparatory to Ordination as a Priest. Permanent Deacons are those who do not intend to be Ordained as a Priest but to exercise their discipleship permanently as a Deacon. They are professional and married men.

It is wonderful that our own parish now has the presence of a Deacon!



Deacon Adrian Gomez BA(Hons)(Syd), GradDipEd(Sec)(ACU), MTh(CIS), MTheol(BBI) is the Youth Ministry Coordinator at St Leo's Catholic College. As well as teaching religious education he organises student visits to nursing homes, homeless services and public schools as assistant catechists. He also organises student liturgies, retreats and participation in Australian Catholic Youth Festivals and World Youth Days. This year he has begun working one day a week at the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal as an Auditor (interviewer) and Advocate (canon law advisor). He is a parishioner at Ku-ring-gai Chase Catholic Parish where for many years he has been involved in music ministry and youth ministry. Adrian is a Team Leader for St Vincent de Paul Night Patrol, on a monthly roster to visit and feed the homeless in the city. He has an interest in theology, particularly the areas of liturgy and sacramental theology. He was ordained as a Permanent Deacon in August 2017. Adrian is married to Dr Cristina Gomez, the Life, Charity and Social Development Coordinator for Broken Bay Diocese whom we know as she has spoken to our Parish as part of our awareness programme on domestic violence. Adrian and Christina have two children, Julian aged 13 and Sophia aged 11.

Adrian will join us for two Masses a weekend, though routinely at 9.15am Mass each Sunday morning, but varying between Saturday evening and Sunday evening. As Deacon he will preach at one of the two Masses at which he is present. Being present each Sunday morning will also enable him to participate in the Baptism Preparation programme, as well as conduct Baptisms. Given his professional background, we would also hope that he might work specifically with the proposed part-time Youth Coordinator we are intending to appoint in the Parish later in the year.

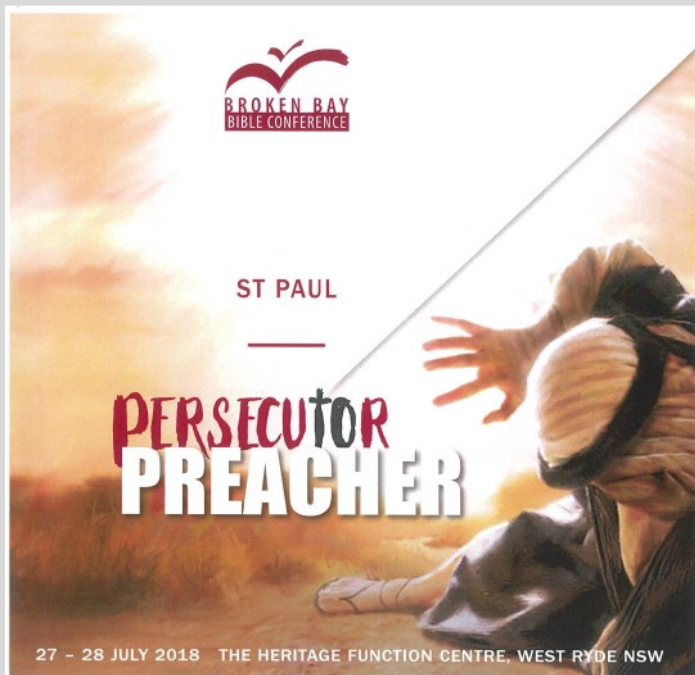

Management of the Recent Bequest of Marie Shortis to our Parish

As I shared with the Parish in the Parish Bulletin a couple of weeks back, we have benefitted from the remarkable generosity of Marie Shortis, who passed away on 27 November 2017. Marie, a much loved and generous parishioner, has bequeathed the Parish the figure of \$185,931.09. This is a most remarkable boost to us as a community. Fifty per cent of this amount is to be "for the benefit of those in necessitous circumstances within the broader parish community . . . and 50% for the benefit of the parish community itself." I have now had the opportunity to consult the Parish Finance Committee about the management of this Bequest. At its meeting on Tuesday 29 May, the Parish Finance Committee unanimously resolved the following. **In respect to the first clause of the bequest:** "That 50% of the bequest be deposited across three specifically named Fixed Term Deposits (2 FTD of \$20,000 and 1 FTD of \$10,000), at variable periods, for the benefit of those in necessitous circumstances in the broader community. Monies will be drawn from these accounts at the time of their maturation on recommendation of the Parish Priest with the PFC, recorded and reported at each PFC meeting as a standing Agenda item." We are currently formulating a clear set of principles and guidelines to assist in our discernment in respect to the distribution of funds. **In respect to the second clause of the bequest:** "That of the 50% of the bequest provided to the benefit of the Parish, that \$50,000 be placed in a Fixed Term Deposit at the service of the launch of the proposed Holy Name Providence Fund; that a further amount be placed at the service of achieving the long held aspiration to achieve a \$50,000 cash reserve, after liabilities, in the Parish operational Account [this would account for about \$20,000]; that the remainder be used for a particularly needed maintenance project [about \$22,000] to be determined later in the year."

We will share with you about some of these matters in the annual Financial Report, but I wish to record my gratitude to the Parish Finance Committee, and our Parish Pastoral Council, for the very thoughtful and constructive engagement of this matter.
