From Fr David

Dear friends,

As you can see by a couple of photos later in the bulletin, we have been continuing our project of cleaning up to the north-eastern entrance to the property. Andrew Placko has done an extraordinary job cleaning out the weed along this stretch, and attending to the dead bamboo. As well, he and Dominic Cantrall have built a series of stone steps down to the bottom of the slope. Cheekily, as you can see by the sign that they have erected, these have been named the Ranson 'memorial steps'! However, I can assure you that the 'memorial' is a little premature!

As you will now see there are two lovely rock retaining walls along the slope. These have been covered over by the bamboo for many years. There is still a lot of work to be done at the base of the slope to clean up the area. With this completed, we will then be able to attend to the repair and maintenance of the storm water drain which is along the boundary. This has been in disrepair for many years. Now that we have much easier access to it we will be able to ensure that it works as it is supposed. Andrew has also repaired the stone retaining wall along the eastern driveway, using his skills as a civil engineering student at University!

The architect of our Parish Bell project, Peter Georgiades, has continued working remarkably hard in the background. There has been so much to consider in respect to engineering aspects and in regard to the construction of the large arch from which the bell will hang. We now have a considered timeline for all the different aspects of the project to come together. However, to ensure that the project is completed for an event which marks the celebration of our 70th anniversary as a Parish, we are proposing we may delay the date for a little while yet—perhaps now to the second half of the year. This will ensure that if there be any unforeseen delay in the construction of the project our celebration will not be affected. So, stay tuned for further updates on our planning! And again, our deepest appreciation to Peter for the amazing work he has put into this project. It really is something very special.

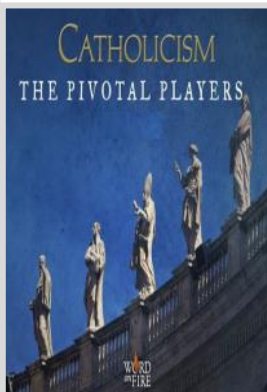
