This week, we're invited to reflect on a beautiful new message from Pope Leo XIV, titled *Dilexi Te* which means "I Have Loved You." In it, the Pope gently reminds us that the heart of being Christian is loving others especially the poor, the forgotten, and the hurting just as Jesus has loved us. Love is not just a feeling, he says, but something we live out in action, with compassion, kindness, and generosity.

We see this lived out in the life of St. Teresa of Avila, whose feast day is on Wednesday, October 15. Teresa was a woman of deep prayer and strong faith. She believed that true change whether in the Church or in our own hearts starts by listening to God and letting His love shape our lives. She teaches us that when we're close to God, we naturally want to help others.

Then on Saturday, October 18, we celebrate St. Luke the Evangelist the writer of the Gospel that shows Jesus reaching out to the poor, the sick, and the outsiders. St. Luke reminds us that we're all called to share God's love through our words, actions, and even small everyday kindnesses. He shows us that mercy is at the heart of the Gospel.

As we reflect on these two great saints and Pope Leo XIV's message, let's ask ourselves: How can I love more like Jesus this week? Maybe it's by helping someone in need, calling a lonely friend, or simply listening with patience. Small acts of love can change lives because that's how Jesus loves us.


The mysteries are grouped into sets:

Vale—Walter Sutcliffe



It was with heavy hearts that we heard of the unexpected and sudden passing of Walter Sutcliffe (1936-2025) on Thursday this week. He was a beloved mentor, friend and a pillar of the musical life of Holy Name for almost 20 years. Over those years we came to know him not just as a gifted conductor and organist, but as a man of deep faith, quiet strength, immeasurable generosity, and possessed of a canny ability to spin a yarn.

Walter was born in Shipley, Yorkshire, in the UK, into a musical family. His mother sang and played piano; his father led a dance band. He went on to study at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London, mastering organ, conducting, singing and double bass. Between 1958 and

1963 he served as a double bassist in the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra under Sir Thomas Beecham, an experience he held in great regard. We always enjoyed his anecdotes about the rather terrifying but bitingly witty Maestro. While with the Royal Phil he toured Russia at the height of the Cold War and this experience provided a rich vein of stories with which Walter would regale the Schola.

On Christmas Eve 1963 he emigrated to Australia with Ann, his organist wife whom he met at the Guildhall. In early 1964 he joined the Sydney Symphony Orchestra, where he served as double bassist for almost thirty years, performing in hundreds of concerts each season. But even as his orchestral life flourished, his heart remained centred in church music.

From 1964 to 1966, he was organist and choirmaster at St Matthew's, Manly. Then, in 1966, he accepted the call to serve at St James', King Street, dedicating twenty-eight years to its choral tradition until 1994. He built a distinctive repertoire of Anglican choral music, oversaw major festival performances and led the rebuilding of the St James' organ — a project he viewed as a personal labour of love. A plaque in the church now commemorates his "distinguished service from 1966 to 1994.



Even after retiring from the Sydney Symphony in 1991, Walter's energy for sacred music never waned. He became a beloved figure at Holy Name Parish, Wahroonga, where for the past twenty years he directed the parish schola, leading its liturgical music monthly at the 9.30am mass. His dedication became a model of consistency, mentorship and reverence, as he shaped that generation of parish singers to serve the liturgy with beauty and meaning.



Walter and Ann eventually made their home in Wentworth Falls and he continued to guide local choral life, directing the Phoenix Singers at Blackheath and leading the Leura church choir. He founded the Blackheath Choral Festival. He also served at All Saints', Woollahra, where he delighted in the charms of its Forster & Andrews organ.

Walter's musical presence was never obtrusive, yet it was always sure. He demanded musical clarity and integrity, but nurtured confidence in those around him. He gave time, wisdom and encouragement to anyone who sought to sing or play. His life was one of humble service; a life where faith, music and community intertwined beautifully. Walter leaves behind more than one generation of musicians, choristers, colleagues and friends whose lives he touched. We give thanks for his enduring legacy and pray that the harmony he cultivated here at Holy Name will echo through eternity.

May he rest in the song of heaven. Farewell Walter Sutcliffe.
