From Fr David

Dear friends,

It is a great pleasure this weekend to welcome some 70 of our children preparing for the Sacrament of the Eucharist at the beginning of June. For the next three Saturday afternoons they will learn more about the Sacrament at the very heart of our Catholic faith and life. In so doing, they will celebrate the completion of their initiation into our Catholic Church which began in their Baptism and unfolded in their Confirmation. A special thank you to all those who are working with Sally Oong, our wonderful Sacramental Coordinator to prepare our children. And a thank you to those who are providing hospitality after our Saturday 5pm Masses to ensure that our children and their families feel especially welcome during this time.

We will continue to stage our Charitable Works Fund Appeal this weekend. This is the Appeal that supports the charitable works of our Diocese, particularly the wonderful work of our pastoral care people at the hospitals throughout our Diocese, as well as contributing to the work of St Lucy's and St Edmund's. Each Parish is expected to meet a certain annual quota for this Appeal, our own quota this year being just on \$32,911. Your generosity for the appeal is most appreciated!

Last Wednesday, Natalie Oong turned 21! Natalie is such a beautiful young woman who contributes so generously to the life of our Parish through her gift and ministry of music. She coordinates and plays the music at all our children's Masses, Sacramental Program Masses, and Young Adults Masses. We congratulate Natalie on such a wonderful milestone and thank her for being such a vibrant part of our parish family!

My experience of being present at the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference in Melbourne for the past week was a most constructive one. There were some 44 bishops from all over Australia present, and the place of our own Diocese of Broken Bay at the table was assured by my own participation. The days were long with five hours of meetings each day. Under the presidency of Archbishop Coleridge of Brisbane, together we reviewed the work of the various Bishops' Commissions and Councils and considered some significant issues facing the Church in Australia at this moment. There is still no indication of when a new Bishop will be appointed to our own Diocese, but I believe the processes continue to unfold and I am hopeful that we may have a new Shepherd to guide us by the end of the year. In the meantime, I now prepare to join the Bishops on their pilgrimage to Rome in June.

- 12) Thanksgiving

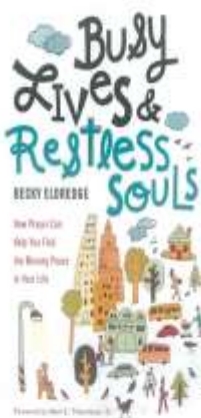

Refurbishment of our Confessional

For the past several years I have been committed to refurbishing our Room for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our current room is not adequate by today's standards: there is no glass in consideration of the Penitent, and there is only one entrance which is not safe for the Confessor. The expectation today is that Confessionals have at least an opaque glass panel which provides some transparency that the room is in use. Thankfully, a very generous parishioner has offered to provide this refurbishment with the design that is on the right hand side below. We express our enormous gratitude to them. The design will have the following features: it allows for two entries—one for the Confessor and one for the Penitent; the opaque glass will not render visible who is in the Confessional but will provide some transparency that the Confessional is in use; the interior of the room will remain as it currently is with the possibility of either confession behind a screen or face to face with the Confessor. Whilst retaining the current screen inside the room, we will look to repaint the room and to enhance the furnishings.

What is envisaged on the eastern side of the church for our Confessional will be duplicated on the western side to ensure aesthetic integrity. The room on the western side of the church, which currently is a store room for chairs, will be converted into a spiritual library for the community. We will need to think about how to store the chairs! However, the other advantage of the glass panels, on both sides of the church, is that they will admit of more light into the church itself, and 'lift' the interior of the church further.

Any change to our beautiful church can raise questions. However, I am hopeful that this particular renewal of our room for the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be a special enhancement of our church. **Fr David**
