

Dear Parishioners of Holy Name,

Reflecting on the Gospel this week (Matthew 25:1-13) we hear the parable about the wise and foolish maidens, teaching us the necessity of being prepared for the Kingdom of Heaven. For us as Christians, "preparedness" is synonymous with growing in Christlike love. How does Christ love? Just look at the Cross. True love is the "complete gift of self."

This week we might reflect on how self-giving love reflected in our lives? In our families, workplace, schools, and social circles. Christlike love requires that we generously offer to others our time, talents, and resources. It invites us to question how we might better bring not just ourselves but also others closer to the Kingdom of Heaven.

This week, our parish extends two unique opportunities to embody this gift: The Catechist Ministry and the Pastoral Works Broken Bay appeal. During November, parishioners are invited to write the name of deceased family members and friends in the Book of Remembrance and leave a donation at the front of the Church.



SRE Teachers for 2024 desperately needed

Special Religious Education (SRE - popularly known as Scripture) is the teaching of our Catholic faith in the state schools. Our parish, Holy Name, is charged with teaching scripture to all year groups at Wahroonga and Warrawee public primary

We teach a weekly 30 minute lesson for each year group at Warrawee on Wednesday mornings at 9am and at Wahroonga on Thursday mornings at 3 different time slots. The materials for teachers and students are provided. This includes a comprehensive teacher's manual and Powerpoint presentation for every lesson.

Training is provided by the Diocese of Broken Bay and can all be done online.

Ideally we need a teacher and assistant for every class and some who can fill in for holidays and sick days. This would require over 30 people. We currently have 10. People are teaching combined classes, multiple classes and we have no one to relieve for holidays, meaning some classes go untaught.

We are very well supported by the beautiful staff of the two schools and the families who are extremely grateful for this teaching of the faith to their children. It is very rewarding and certainly helps one's own faith development.

I would be so grateful to anyone who would like to get involved and join us. Beginning as an assistant would be an easy way to get started. Maybe you have a friend and would like to do it together.

PASTORAL WORKS BROKEN BAY— Our Parish quota for 2023/2024 is \$43,712

The apportionment of quotas between Parishes is based on relative income – not absolute income. The overall Levy for the Diocese has been set at the same total as in 2022/23, therefore any change in your Parish quota represents: Any increase or decrease in your Parish income between those 2 years; Your Parish income relative to all other Parishes; and any change in student numbers.

Whilst your parish income may have increased or decreased in absolute terms, your income relative to other parishes is the relevant factor. I know you will also appreciate that: the work of the catechists in providing instruction to children in your parish that do not attend Catholic schools is vital to the mission of the Church; and the Catholic Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Program both provides succour to those in need and alleviates calls that would otherwise be directed to local parish priests. These ministries enrich the pastoral care of all Parishes and must still be financed.

The overall Diocesan PWBB Levy for 2023/24 has been retained at the same overall level as the past several years, despite the rising costs of running the ministries, in accordance with the wishes of the Consultors and Bishop Anthony. Bishop Anthony and the Consultors have also reviewed and approved the quotas for each Parish for 2023/24.
