14 December 2025 THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

In the new world to come, the humbled and the poor have the first place.

Dear friends,

The third Sunday of advent is like one more step forward towards Christmas. The prophet Isaiah is one of the divine messengers who accompanies us along as we journey to the fulfilment of God promise. His prophecy is a call to get prepared for the coming of the Messiah. Isaiah announces a new world where justice and peace shall flourish. It shall be a kind of a new society whereby people are going to learn how to live together in brotherly love.

In a society created by men, generally those who seems to be high position or first social rank are those who have money, power and knowledge. However in the divine society, those who are humble will be in the first rank because their hearts are open to the promise of the Lord. It is indeed joyful news for the poor, the needy and all those who trust the Lord.

According to the tradition of the church, this third Sunday of Advent season is well known as *Gaudete* Sunday, from the Latin word *Gaudete* means "rejoice". In the middle of Advent the liturgy invites us to pause for a while and to lift our hearts in joy. Because the coming of the Lord is closer than we dare to think, even we dare to believe.

Like Isaiah, John the Baptist also continues to lead us throughout this Advent journey. John acknowledges sincerely that he is not the Messiah. His joy in the preparation of the coming of Jesus is not only to convey a baptism of repentance but more importantly, it is to point Christ to others.

In that sense, the humility of John the Baptism is a lesson for us. Our Christian joy must be found not in self promotion, but rather, in revealing Christ to others through our words, actions and compassion.

That is why a rose candle of this third Sunday of Advent wreath is not only a symbol but a mission. It calls us to become bearers of joy. This joy grows only when it is shared with others. The church teaches that joy can be shared through a word of encouragement or through a gesture of forgiveness. As regard to the needy, joy can also be shared via generosity and good acts as well as through prayer that opens the heart to God's peace.

Dear friends, rejoice! the Lord is near...

May this joyful hope be in our hearts and fill our families and our communities.

the coming of Jesus.


We ask you now to bless our Advent Wreath and all who gather round it.
