Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and marks the beginning of the forty days (excl Sundays) of Lent.



From Fr Paul

Dear Parishioners,

You are being invited once again to enter into the season Lent, a special period of 40 days.

The number of 40 days (excluding Sundays) is symbolic of a journey, a period of waiting, challenge and encounter with God. A period of 40 days is experienced frequently in Scripture (eg: Noah, Moses, Elijah, Jonah, Jesus). The stories all suggest that 40 days, well spent, can lead to a miracle, to a major change of heart, to a transformation in our relationship with God and with others—family, friends, neighbours and work colleagues. There are questions I may ask of myself: How will I keep a good Lent?

How often have I lived through these weeks of Lent without paying much attention to prayer, penance, fasting, and almsgiving? How often have I missed the spiritual fruits of the season without even being aware of it? How can I ever really celebrate Easter without observing Lent? How can I rejoice fully in the Resurrection when I have avoided participating in the Lord's Passion?

With Henri Nouwen I pray: "Yes, Lord, I have to die – with you, through you, and in you – and thus become ready to recognise you when you appear to me in your Resurrection. There is so much in me that needs to die: false attachments, greed and anger, impatience and stinginess.... I see clearly now how little I have died with you, really gone your way and been faithful to it. O Lord, make this Lenten season different from other ones. Let me find you again. Amen."

At Holy Name, let us support and encourage one another to 'keep a good Lent'. How is the Spirit calling you to respond? What will you do this Lent? How will you 'keep a good Lent'?
