Dear friends,

This Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent is known as 'Gaudete' Sunday from the old Latin word for 'rejoice'. The Mass invites us to be joyful because of the closeness of the Lord. But in preparing for that coming the people ask John the Baptist the question in the gospel today: "What must we do?"

The composer and performer Bradley James set Mother Teresa of Calcutta's prayers and teachings to music. Bradley remembers Mother Teresa's words: 'Mother said "we don't have to go to Calcutta to help the poor, rather we must help those right in front of us." He applied this lesson when he encountered a homeless beggar on the streets of San Francisco. Bradley placed some money in his metal cup, and then reached out to shake the man's hand. Bradley says the man pulled him a little closer and said: "thanks for the money but what I really wanted was a handshake."

"What must we do?" John the Baptist answers by exhorting the people to be people of integrity and compassion in what they are already doing. 'Tax collectors are to be honest; soldiers must be content with their pay and not abuse their authority; and people in general must reach out to the poor.' (Lk 3: 4-6).

There is always the temptation for us to think that God is asking us to achieve extraordinary steps in bringing about the Kingdom of God. But, I think God is asking most of us to be faithful to our calling here and now. Mother Teresa once said that people in our world are hungry for love, by saying that the greatest hunger for love in our world is loneliness. A handshake, visiting someone who is lonely, reaching out to someone who we may have neglected for some time is all we need do.
