



## 15th February 2026 - 6th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME

Brothers and sisters,

In the readings this Sunday, we are called to learn that true righteousness goes beyond legalistic adherence to rules. It requires a heartfelt commitment to God. The Church recommends we listen to Jesus who calls us, the believers, to deeper and inner conversion.

This inner conversion consists of changing our bad intentions first and our hearts than rather our external actions. Ben Sirach emphasises in the first reading that God gave us an exceptional gift. That gift is our freedom. God sets before us life and death, fire and water. By doing that, He does not want to intervene in our lives without our agreement because He is not a God who acts by imposition or dominion. He acts fundamentally by respecting our freedom. While making choices for our lives, God through our conscience, tells us and advises us always to choose life. We hear that often from the inner voice of our conscience.

Most often, we do make bad choices and bear the consequences. Unfortunately, we blame God for allowing such bad consequences. However, we forget that He gave us the gift of freedom and that advice of choosing life. It is actually, our responsibility of aligning our freedom with God's wisdom that helps to see things beyond the appearances and to choosing what is good.

This is what Jesus teaches in the Gospel. He challenges us to move beyond mere legal compliance to a deeper, interior righteousness. Jesus warns us that it is not enough to avoid murder; we must not harbour anger. It is not enough to avoid adultery; we must keep our hearts pure. Our faith must be reflected in our innermost thoughts, not just our actions.

Jesus highlights that human heart and our thoughts are the source and the cause of our actions. If they are cleaned, there should not be any longer murder, anger or adultery. In regard to that, Jesus recalls us to God's wisdom or spiritual wisdom and integrity of life. This spiritual wisdom refers to embodying God's will in our lives not just following rules. As regard to integrity, this concerns honesty. Jesus is clear about that: "Let your 'Yes' mean Yes and your 'No', mean No". Do our daily lives reflect sincere and undivided hearts?

**First Reading:** Sir 15:15-20: *He never commanded anyone to be godless.*

## What Is Lent?

*Lent is a time of spiritual preparation, self-examination, and penance leading up to the celebration of Easter. Catholics use this time to imitate Jesus' forty days of fasting in the desert.*

*It is an opportunity for us to deepen our relationship with God, seek forgiveness for sins, and grow in spiritual discipline. Catholics focus on self-denial, prayerful reflection, and charitable acts as a means of drawing closer to God.*



**Fasting (Age 18–59):** Obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. It involves limiting food intake to one full meal and two smaller meals, with no eating in between.

**Abstinence (Age 14+):** Obligatory on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. It forbids eating meat (beef, pork, chicken), but fish, dairy, eggs, and condiments made from animal fat are permitted.

**Purpose:** These practices serve as acts of reparation for sins, turning away from selfish desires, and fostering a spirit of prayer and sacrifice.

**Exceptions:** People with health conditions, pregnant or nursing women, or those unable to fast for medical reasons are exempt from the strict rules.
