15th June 2025 — The Most Holy Trinity

Dear friends,

This week we celebrate the Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. We know that the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is not a puzzle to be solved, but rather an experience to be lived out in our daily lives as Christians have done for centuries.

One of the greatest examples of the Trinity comes from St. Cyril the teacher of the Slavs. He tried to explain the Mystery of the Trinity by using the sun as an example. He said, "God the Father is that blazing sun. God the Son is its light and God the Holy Spirit is its heat- but there is only one sun. So there are three Persons in the Holy Trinity but God is one and undivided."

I think this is a good example for us as the Scriptures this weekend from the Book of Proverbs, St. Paul to the Romans and the Gospel of John, all speak about God as being poured out. Using St. Cyril's example, God pours out his love in us like the heat and rays of the sun. Enlightening us and transforming us as members of His Kingdom. While the Trinity pours itself out toward us, we equally pour ourselves out in loving service to one another.

We are created in love to be a community of persons in love with one another, just as the Trinity is the essence of divine love for the world.

In Baptism we are called into loving union with God the Creator, God the Redeemer and God the Sanctifier.

Like the Father we are called to build up and create a peaceful and loving world. Like the Son we are called to be models of service in helping to reconcile the world and the Church as One. God, the Holy Spirit is our advocate who helps us discover the truth about the continuing work amongst us of the saving love of Jesus.

Let us pray for an outpouring of the Trinity into our hearts so that we may become a community of Love.




Children's Liturgy is held in the Parish Sunroom every Sunday at 9:30am Mass during school terms, with pre-school to school age children welcome to attend.


