16 November 2025 33rd SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME

'THE SUN OF RIGHTEOUSNESS WILL SHINE WITH HEALING IN ITS RAYS'

Today the first reading speaks to us about the sun, not the sun above in the sky. It tells us about another kind of sun. In God's name prophet Malachi says, "For you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine with healing in its rays".

Prophet Malachi speak of two kinds of people: the evil doers and those who fear the Lord. The evil-doers will be burn up by a burning furnace and those who fear the Lord will be healed by "the sun of righteousness'. What does fear of the Lord means? We know what fear is: fear of being sick, fear of death; fear of wild animals or fear of what can enemy do to us. We should not fear God in this way. This is not what God want from us. When we talk about fearing God, we mean that we should have for Him the respect and love of a child of child who wants to please his father/mother in everything. He is careful not to do anything to hurt his father/mother. In this way, we could say that this child is afraid of causing sorrow to the father he loves.

This is how it should be with us and God, our Father. We should have great respect for Him. Because we love Him, we should be careful not to do anything that offends Him. And doing all we can to please Him in all things.

The gospel speaks frightening words. Today is the 33rd Sunday of the year. We are coming to the end of the liturgical year 2025. Next Sunday will be the last Sunday. And that is why the gospel tells us about the end of the world. Jesus says: "All these things you are staring at now...the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed". Hearing this, His Apostles are wondering how they will recognise that is about to happen? Master, when will this happen, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?"

Jesus answer to His Apostles is what is happening right now in our backyards and in front of our noses. In the TV and Newspapers news of the hour, day, week, months and years are scary to watch and read. And Jesus adds: "There will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven". In Mathew's gospel 24:29- "The sun will be darkened". Is Jesus frightening us? NO. But a warning: "Take care not to be deceived". The are likely to happen but it is not the end. The end of the world as we know it, Not the end of everything. Remember God's promise: "The sun of righteousness will shine with healing in its rays".

The Sun of God's love, mercy, God's forgiveness, and compassion for His children will endure forever. As the sun in the sky does for our bodies, the loving-mercy of God bring healing to our hearts.







Urgent Appeal for More Catechists - Can you please help?

The original meaning of "catechist" is one who "echoes God's word", however catechists are much more than that. Facilitating a child's faith formation is a rewarding experience that does not require a teacher's degree or an advanced degree in theology: all it requires is enthusiasm, as well as generosity in sharing your time with others.

Are you looking for a new way to give back to the community? Have you thought about volunteering? You may or may not be aware, but there is a shortage of volunteers instructing Catholic children in public schools within our area. Public schools in NSW offer Special Religious Education each week which is volunteer driven.

As baptised Catholics, we are called to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and one of the most rewarding ways to fulfil this call is to be part of the parish team of catechists. We have Catechist classes at Warrawee Public School on Wednesday mornings and at Wahroonga Public School ("The Bush School") on Thursday mornings. The lessons are for 30 minutes.

All resources are supplied and training is offered by the Diocese of Broken Bay. We have a wonderful group of dedicated Catechists doing this, but many are taking multiple classes or have combined groups as we need more volunteers.
