Dear friends,

Last weekend we witnessed the 'City to Surf' race which runs from Hyde park in the city to Bondi beach. Thousands go into training for the big event, but for many simply to participate is all part of the experience. As one observer remarked: 'if you feel you can't finish the race, the crowd will bring you home.' This does seem to be the case as we see the last runners make the finishing line being cheered on by others. In the letter to the Hebrews this week, the author says that we are like runners in a race. It is a good metaphor for the Christian life.

We all know how easy it is to start the race high on adrenalin. But after a short while we start to feel the strain of running. And then there are the challenges like Heartbreak Hill. We need an extra burst of energy and motivation to conquer the most gruelling part of the race. But as the author to the Hebrews says: 'we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses.' He is referring to the saints who have already run the race and are cheering us on.


We have always been conscious as a Church that we are part of a larger race, where we don't do this alone. We are following a path made 'holy' by so many witness who spur us on. Saints are ordinary women and men like you and me. They were sinners like us, but with the help of God's grace they did something beautiful with their lives.

We are not running the race alone, but are part of a community where we feel supported and loved which encourages us to persevere when the going gets tough.

St. Paul in writing to Timothy, who, in prison and about to die, gives us his final testimony to the race he has run. "I have run the race, I have kept the faith, now all that awaits me is the crown of righteousness. Not only to me but all those who have longed for his appearing.' Let us pray today that with St. Paul as our 'holy' witness, we will stay on the path to eternal life.

The Spiritan (Holy Ghost) Order in Australia: A Snapshot

Origins & Mission

The **Congregation of the Holy Spirit**, commonly known as the **Spiritans** or **Holy Ghost Fathers**, was founded in Paris in **1703** by **Claude-François Poullart des Places**; later revitalized in **1848** through a merger with a congregation founded by Francis Libermann.

Spiritans in Australia

- ♦ The Spiritans began engaging in mission work in Australia starting in the **1970s**:
- ♦ They returned in 1971, initially to Queensland, then expanded to Victoria (1977), New South Wales (1991), and Western Australia (1992)
- A key milestone was the establishment of **Holy Spirit Parish**, Bray Park, Queensland, around **1974**, delegated by the archbishop to the Spiritans those states, working alongside **four parishes in Papua New Guinea**.
- Personnel-wise, the Spiritans in Oceania—including Australia—comprise priests and brothers from diverse nations such as Ghana, Ireland, Kenya, Madagascar, Malawi, Nigeria, PNG, Tanzania, Uganda and Vietnam. As recent as 2024, Australia is home to nine active and two retired Spiritan priests, illustrating their active presence today.

Institutions & Ministry

- The Spiritans are officially registered under Australian charitable frameworks, e.g., at **Strathpine**, **QLD** (National Redress Scheme records and ACNC listings refer to them as the **Congregation of the Holy Spirit Australia**, also known as **The Spiritans Australia**).
- They minister through a network of parishes and churches across Australia. These include: Churches in Western Australia (e.g., Broomehill, Cranbrook, Kojonup, South Hedland, Newman, Frankland, Tambellup, Tom Price), and in Queensland (e.g., St Michael's, Dorrington and Church of the Holy Spirit, Bray Park).

Broader Role & Values

- ♦ Globally and in Australia, Spiritans focus on **evangelisation**, **education**, and **pastoral care**, aiming to build **local**, **sustainable faith communities** that reflect local culture and leadership.
- As part of **Spiritans Oceania**, they engage in retreats, parish life, educational initiatives, and community events tailored to Australian and PNG contexts.
- The Spiritans are officially recognised among religious orders in Australia under Catholic Religious Australia (CRA) listings as **Spiritans Congregation of the Holy Spirit (CSSp)**.

From Bishop Anthony



To the People of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay

11 August 2025

My dear sisters and brothers,

I share with you an important development in our Diocese, and for the Parish of Wahroonga.

As you will appreciate, the term of Fr Kelvin Lovegrove as Parish Priest of the Parish of Wahroonga finishes at the end of August 2025. Fr Kelvin came to us from the Archdiocese of Sydney under a three-year arrangement with the Archbishop, which will conclude with a period of sabbatical that Fr Kelvin will commence in September 2025. I express my heartfelt gratitude to the Archbishop of Sydney and to Fr Kelvin for their generosity of assistance to our Diocese and to the Parish of Wahroonga.

I am also deeply grateful to Fr John Puliparambil for his service to the Parish over these last two years whilst he has been undertaking further studies in pastoral care. I am ready also now to provide Fr John with a new appointment to take effect in the coming months once his current studies are completed.

In recent times, the Congregation of the Holy Spirit (the Spiritans) has approached me to re-establish their presence in the Diocese of Broken Bay. The Spiritans had the care of the Parish of St Joseph, Narabeen and the Parish of St Rose, Collaroy from 2004-2011, prior to the formation of the Parish of The Lakes. The Spiritans are an international Religious Congregation, founded in France in 1703 and, in Australia, currently have missions in the dioceses of Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth, Geraldton, and Newcastle-Maitland.

I will appoint two Spiritan Fathers to the Parish of Wahroonga, effective 10 September 2025: Fr Gaspar Mushi, CSSp, to the position of Parish Priest, and Fr Jules-Davy Malonga, CSSp, to the position of Assistant Priest. Fr. Gaspar, who hails originally from Tanzania, aged 65 and ordained in 1994, brings over ten years of experience from his time serving in Australia. Fr. Jules-Davy, from The Democratic Republic of the Congo, aged 49, and ordained in 2011, has dedicated a significant portion of his missionary work to Europe, particularly in the Netherlands. I intend, also, to appoint Fr Jules with special responsibility for McQuoin Park and the Hornsby Hospital.

Importantly, though staffed by the Spiritan Fathers, the Parish of Wahroonga will remain a diocesan parish, rather than one entrusted formally to a Religious Order. I have determined that this appointment will initially be for a term of three years.




OCCASIONAL DRIVER NEEDED:


