### 17 March—Feast of Saint Patrick

Saint Patrick (about 402 - March 17, 491) is the patron saint of Ireland. Saint Patrick came from a Christian family. He was the son of a deacon in the church. According to the autobiographical Confession of Patrick, when he was about sixteen years old, he was captured by Irish pirates. They took him from his home in Britain and sold him as a slave in Ireland. He explains that the Lord had mercy and allowed him to be forgiven his sins and convert to Christianity. While in captivity, Patrick worked as a shepherd and strengthened his relationship with God through prayer.

St. Patrick's Day is celebrated every year on March 17 in his honour.

St Patrick is said to have used the shamrock in his missionary work. A shamrock has three leaves on each stem. Patrick used this to explain the idea of the Holy Trinity—the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. **St Patrick, pray for us.**


