Principles of Registration

- ◆ People can nominate one Mass over the course of one fortnight
- ◆ This will enable 280 people to attend Mass once a fortnight
- ◆ If the demand is greater then we will need to lengthen the roster from fortnightly to three-weekly
- ◆ Unless people have registered, they will not be able to attend
- ◆ Those who are present must have their names recorded for the purposes of notification if one attendee becomes infected with the virus
- ◆ Until we are able to hold religious gatherings of up to 100, Sunday Masses will be made available online
- ◆ During this time, the Sunday Obligation remains suspended

Dear friends,

It is wonderful that we can begin to gather again for Eucharist, limited though the numbers can be. Our fortnightly schedule has quickly filled in with groups of 10 at each Mass. We will need to monitor the situation and adapt should the demand outstrip our fortnightly capacity. However, I am hopeful at this stage that we can maintain our fortnightly schedule. This will enable 280 people to attend Mass once a fortnight so this is a good start to the long road back to the time when our community can gather freely again.

In the meantime, we will continue the level of communication that we have maintained over the last couple of months.

Please remember in your prayer, Connie Boland who passed away on 13 May, aged 98. Connie has not lived with us here in the parish for some years, but she was very actively involved in our community for many years, along with her husband John. Together they, and their family, lived in Bobbin Head Rd. Connie was farewelled from Our Lady of Good Counsel in Forestville on Monday 18 May. I am sure many will remember her. Eternal rest grant unto Connie, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her.

Shayne D’Cunha, a student seminarian of our Diocese, who was resident with us for the last 8 weeks, left us on Monday to return to Good Shepherd Seminary for the remainder of the semester. We thank him for the wonderful contribution that he made to our life together here in the priory over that time, and for the ways in which he led a number of activities over this time, including the Tuesday evening Rosary by Zoom. An Examen for Life During COVID-19

*Take a moment to settle. Take a deep breath.
Get comfortable. Like a rock settling on the bottom of a lake
after it's thrown in, let yourself settle.*



1. Acknowledge how you are feeling in this moment. If being calm is hard, acknowledge it. If you find yourself frustrated or stressed, acknowledge it. God wants to be present in all parts of our lives—not just the easy or serene moments.
2. Ask for light and insight as you prepare to review your day. For some that light may come in the form of a sense of the Divine. For others it's from a deep sense of your true self.
3. Take a moment to think about how COVID-19 has impacted your life. Even as we are being asked to distance ourselves from one another physically, ask yourself what connections you find yourself grateful for? Who makes you feel grounded and connected to God?
4. Public health issues have a way of making us recognise how interwoven our lives are with others in society. It can help us realise who we may often choose not to see or connect with. Is there a person or group of people especially affected by COVID-19 that you don't often choose to see or connect with normally? What connections to others are you becoming more aware of? Who do you normally choose to reach out and connect to? Who do you avoid or refuse to see? If you can, picture the faces of these people. What connections do you take for granted in your life? What connections impact you the most?
5. Note the emotions you feel when you think of these individuals without judging or over analyzing. Simply acknowledge them, pay attention, and listen to where God may be speaking.
6. As you think of the ways we are connected or disconnected to one another, pick a connection (or lack thereof) that seems important, significant, or is manifesting itself the strongest. Pause and reflect on where you're being invited to grow from that moment. If you are a person of faith, take a moment to pray with it.
7. God gifted us with limitless creativity and imagination. Even in this time of separation and possible isolation, what is one way you can maintain meaningful connection to others—whether directly, through technology, or intentional focus and attention?

When you are ready,
return to your day.*
