REFLECTION by Nick Brodie: Jesus tells his disciples straight: Lording it over people 'is not to happen among you.' Considering this, Pope Francis suggests we reflect on our daily lives and aspirations. If all we do in in our daily lives is oriented 'to feed our ambition, to climb the ladder of success, to reach important positions', then what would Jesus say to us?

He might remind us to serve each other within the Christian community itself and to become servants 'to all'. We are called to build up the community of faith through mutual service. And, as individuals and as a community, we are also called to serve the world.

The Pope suggests that we can 'discover God's way of doing things' by contemplating Jesus, who 'lowered himself to wash our feet'. We should, both as a Church and as individual Christians, always seek to humbly 'put ourselves at the service of others'.

As the Church continues its synodal journey, this message should resonate deeply. Even within the Church, the Pope acknowledges, people can get lost by a 'quest for personal prestige'. 
