21st April – FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear friends,

We have all been saddened and shocked by the rampage of one man who took so many innocent lives while people were going about their daily business. The tragedy at the Bondi Shopping Centre last week calls us to pray for those who died, commending them to the love and mercy of our Father in Heaven.

We also pray for those who were injured and those traumatised by the unfolding incident. While we try to come to terms with the outcome of this painful episode in our city, we are heartened by those who, at risk to their own lives, sought to try and stop the attack from injuring more people, and thus saving lives.

This weekend we also commemorate the men and women who served as ANZACS in World War I. We remember the futile loss of human life, and the bravery of those who fought selflessly to preserve peace in our world. ANZAC Day is a time to remember in our minds and hearts the enormous sacrifice made by so many to keep our world free from the horrors of war and violence.

We are all part of this struggle to preserve and give dignity to human life. We don't shy away from the pain and discomfort that comes with human loss and grief. While there are no easy solutions or answers to the cost to innocent lives in our world, the cross of Jesus, for us as Christians, does stand as a beacon of hope, because not only did Christ suffer at the hands of those sought his downfall, but he died a self-giving and redeeming death for us all.

More especially, during this time of Easter, we, commemorate His resurrection from the dead giving hope and courage to us all. The wounded and risen Jesus, is the one who heals us from the fear and anxiety which freed the disciples to be instruments of love and peace inflamed with the love of the Holy Spirit.

First Reading: Acts 4:8-12: *This is the only name by which we can be saved.*

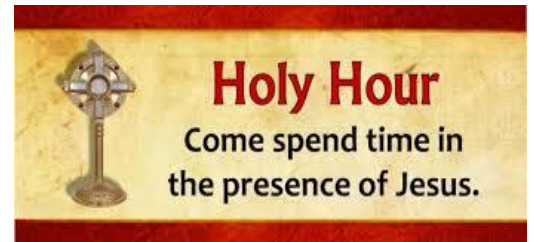

Following Confirmation, the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion are celebrated the following year.

Confirmation Candidates must be baptised, in Year 3 or older and able to attend the preparation as outlined below.

Eligibility: Candidates must be Baptised, aged 8 or older and be in at least Year 3 at school. In our Diocese of Broken Bay, the Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated **before** Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

And a glory that shines upon our tears.

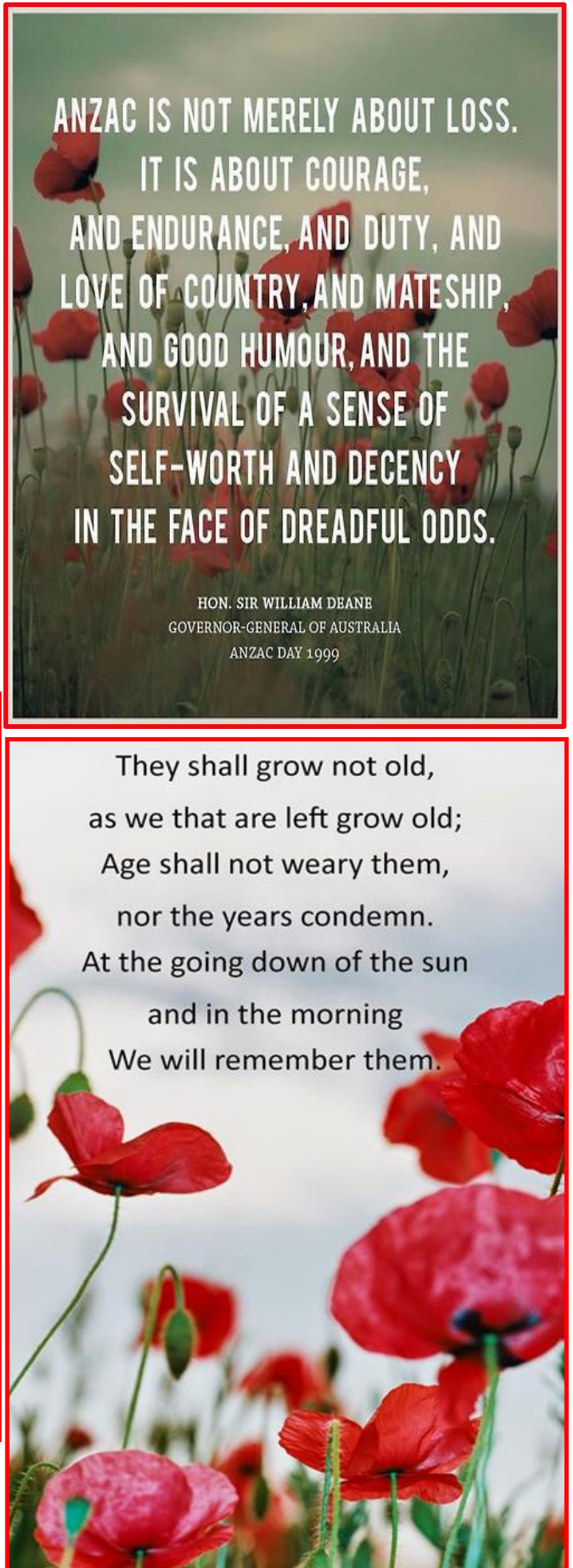
They went with songs to the battle,
