PENTECOST: THE SPIRIT WHO MAKES US ONE

Dear Parishioners,

Pentecost is often called the birth of the Church. Fifty days after Easter, the frightened disciples, who had locked themselves away in fear, were transformed into courageous witnesses of Christ. Today's scripture reminds us that the Church was not built by human effort, but through the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the first reading, we see the disciples gathered in prayer. The Spirit came when, suddenly, a noise like a rushing wind filled the house, and tongues of fire rested upon them. The Spirit enabled them to speak in many languages so that people from diverse cultural backgrounds could understand the Good News. This experience underscores how Pentecost reverses the confusion of Babel in the Old Testament. Where sin divided humanity, the Holy Spirit now creates unity. Diversity is no longer a barrier; it has become a gift.

For a parish like ours, Holy Name, entrusted to the care of the Congregation of the Holy Spirit (Spiritans), this message holds special significance. The Spiritans were founded by Claude Poullart des Places and later revitalised by François Libermann, driven by a missionary heart to bring the Gospel to the poor across cultures, languages, and peoples around the world. Moved by the Holy Spirit's zeal, Spiritans often serve in challenging areas where the local Church struggles to provide pastoral care.

A day like this, we are all, in a sense, called to be "Spiritans." We are reminded of the Holy Spirit received at our Baptism and affirmed through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Pentecost recalls to our minds that the Church is universal. Our parish community reflects this reality and beauty whenever people from different cultural backgrounds gather around the altar in faith and love.

Saint Paul, in the Second Reading, explains that the Holy Spirit gives different gifts to different people. But all gifts come from the same Spirit and are meant for the same goal. No gift is too small in the eyes of God. Reflecting on these divine gifts, we are challenged to ask: What gift has the Holy Spirit given me for the building up of the Church?

Dear friends, a vibrant parish is not sustained solely by priests or religious; rather, it flourishes when every baptised person shares his or her gifts generously. The Spirit continues to work today through choir members, catechists, youth leaders, volunteers, parents, and all who serve with love and humility. Too often, out of fear and uncertainty, we locked and closed the doors of our hearts, hesitant to join one of these vital ministries. Jesus, in the Gospel, utters a powerful word: "Peace be with you," as He breathes on them. The Spirit that raised Him from the dead gives us courage and a mission. He gives us peace in times of anxiety, strength in moments of weakness, and hope when we feel discouraged. As we celebrate Pentecost, may it be a celebration of an outpouring of the Holy Spirit in our parishes and the Spiritan mission around the world. Like the first disciples, may we leave behind fear and become living witnesses of Christ's love.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love,

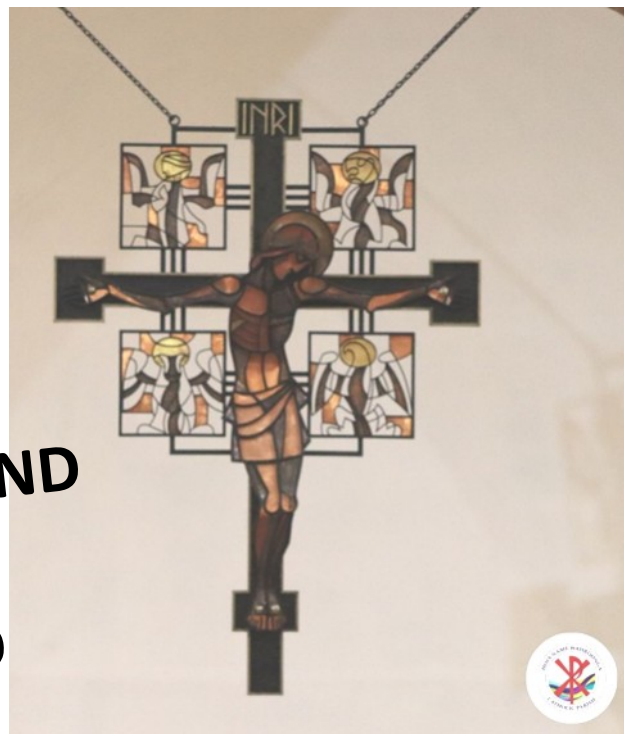

It is located on the right hand side as you enter the Church next to the notice board behind the last pew.
