## *25th August - 21st SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME*

Dear friends,

In the Masses this weekend we hear from the gospel of St. John on Jesus as the Bread of Life, concluding with his pronouncement that: his flesh is real food and his blood real drink!

Certainly Jesus's teaching is a complex one, and many leave him today because for them, his teaching is just too hard. His way of life, taking up one's cross and following him each day requires making that choice.

In the gospels, it is Peter who is often asking Jesus the question: 'having left everything behind in following Jesus, what can he possibly give in return?' But today, when Jesus asks the questions of the disciples, as to whether they want to leave him too, Peter says: 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'

This deeply spiritual insight I think is the key to the challenge of belief in the Eucharist. Peter, has grown deeply in his faith relationship to Jesus. Peter knows that food and drink become part of us, but, through consuming the food and drink of Jesus, His Body and Blood, we become individually and communally the Body of Christ. Where people unite as one for some ideal, Jesus presents us with a way of life which is both sustained by his presence with us, and understood through his example of service and love for all.

May Christ endow us with spiritual insight into him as the Bread of Life sent by God to give life to the world.

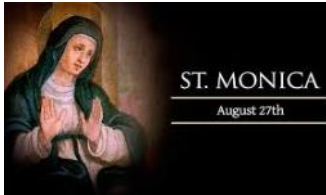

## What do the Readings say to us this Sunday - 21st SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME

**First Reading:** Josh 24:1-2, 15-18: We will serve the Lord God, because he is our God.

**Second Reading:** Eph 5:21-32: This is the great mystery, it applies to Christ and the Church. Alleluia, alleluia!  
Your words, Lord, are spirit and life: you have the words of everlasting life.  
Alleluia!

**Gospel:** Jn 6:60-69: Lord, who shall we go to? You have the words of everlasting life.



**St Monica—27 August** Saint Monica's life is a testament to the two virtues of Patience and Perseverance. These two virtues, though seemingly the same, are slightly different. The virtue of Patience helps people remain calm and not to complain when other people otherwise would. Most of the time, this virtue is practiced in relationships with other people and in situations where many things go wrong.

The virtue of Perseverance might demand greater moral strength. Although it is based on the virtue of Patience, it is also the strength to keep going in difficult situations where you feel like giving up.

Saint Monica is an example of these two virtues because she practiced them with her husband and his mother, and especially with her son, Augustine.



**St Augustine—28 August** Saint Augustine was one of the wisest persons in the Catholic Church. His teachings and writings are still studied to this day. The experience of his life, especially his conversion, serves as a great example of our journey to God as Christians. One of his speeches, which is still quoted today, is: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."
