My dear friends,

on behalf of Fr. Anselm and Deacon Adrian and myself a very Happy Christmas!

Each year the generosity of people towards us is quite remarkable and very touching. Thank you for your many gifts and good wishes this Christmas. It is a little overwhelming, and not possible to thank everyone personally for your kindness. However, know that your generosity and affection is deeply appreciated. Christmas is not just a time to give and receive gifts, but more significantly it is a time to be grateful for the gift of others in our lives. The most important gifts come wrapped, not in paper, but in persons, and this Christmas I am truly grateful for the gift that each of you is in our community of faith.

This year finishes so differently from how it started. Bishop Peter was announced as Archbishop of Melbourne on the 29 June, and was installed on 1 August. Two days later on 3 August I was elected to the service of Diocesan Administrator to lead our diocese until such time as the Holy Father appoints us a new Bishop. It has hard to believe that I have now been in this ministry for nearly 5 months. It is impossible to know how long we might wait, though it would seem most likely our waiting will extend at least into the first half of 2019. In the meantime, we have been so gifted by the presence of Fr Anselm with us. It would not be possible for me to undertake both roles as Diocesan Administrator and Parish Priest without Fr Anselm's presence with us, and on behalf of the whole community, I thank him for his gentle, caring ministry. We look forward to him being with us for well into the future. This year we have also welcomed the appointment of Deacon Adrian Gomez. Deacon Adrian has brought his many gifts to us and it is wonderful that we are celebrating this Christmas as a great team of men dedicated to the life and up-building of our parish family. I am particularly grateful to Deacon Adrian for his contribution during the time of my proposed 'sabbatical' (which never quite eventuated!) during the months of July and August.

Though every year brings its changes, your unmistakable goodness and generosity truly enliven our community. There are too many people to thank personally in such a short space. However, I take this opportunity to pay tribute to all those who, most often in very hidden ways, give life to our community: our parish office and pastoral staff and volunteers, all those associated with maintaining the beauty and order of our church through cleaning, flower display, banners; those who so diligently keep our grounds looking so attractive; our many gifted musicians and singers and ministers who lead us so faithfully and beautifully in our liturgies; those who exercise a ministry of welcome and hospitality and service to those who join us at the Eucharist; those who welcome our children at Eucharist and those who prepare our children and families for the sacraments in different ways; all those who coordinate and undertake our various parish ministries, particularly in outreach to our children at our government schools, to those who are sick in the hospitals and nursing homes in our parish, and to those less advantaged than ourselves; the leaders and members of our parish committees, especially our Parish Pastoral Council, our Parish Finance Committee, our Parish Fundraising Committee. And then, there is the army of those who have enabled us to celebrate such memorable liturgies this Christmas time. They have given of their time and expertise so generously in such diverse ways.

For the gift of everyone who makes the life of Holy Name Parish so special, this Christmas, we give humble thanks to God.



Christmas Reflection from Fr David

Dear friends,

There is a magic in every beginning, wrote the German philosopher Herman Hesse. How true this is when we experience the birth of our children, when we hold a newborn baby in our arms, when we delight in the pure wonder and sense of play evidence in young children. When we gaze upon a child we are caught intensely between an immediate experience of the present and a heightened expectation of the future.

The recovery of the 'child in us' is indeed a task that is always set before us. It is the challenge for us even in our old age when we might "blow away the chaff of many things, so as to reveal the essential wheat of our time on earth," according to Daniel O'Leary. He goes on to observe, "Our souls are always young. They have preserved, in a safe place, the fields of dreams that once lay beautifully across the landscapes of our childhood. It is in these fields, and in no other, where the seeds of our God-like beauty were first nurtured, that our eternal harvest will be reaped. We do not outgrow our childhood. We grow into it more fully as we grow older. And it is only in heaven that we will possess it completely."

It is not surprising then that for Jesus the child is the image of the gospel's invitation. Every child "represents a new beginning of life . . . original, completely incomparable" and every birth "strengthens and confirms the great hope for the victory of life" that each of us cherish deep within us even in the midst of the distortions of our life journeys, our failures, our cynicism and frustration. In every child God waits for us to stir again within us the sense of new beginnings, of fresh possibilities, of awakening hopes. The divine invitation set before us is forever to become like a child so that, no matter our circumstances, life might be born again and begin afresh. On this most holy day we dare to proclaim that God has become a child. We celebrate that God has not only emptied himself of divinity to become one of us so as to share our humanity but that God has become a child. Childhood remains in God eternally. For God is an eternal beginning, an infinite possibility, an unquenchable awakening, pure presence. And if this be so, then, as we gaze upon the Divine Child at Bethlehem, we can let go of life's dead ends. We can see beyond the apparent blockages created by our failures and mistakes. We can glimpse beyond the stifling messages that we have received about ourselves. We can break open the tomb of our hurts and our bitterness. We can break open the numbness created by our fear of imagination. We can breathe again, weep again, laugh again, love again. The child within us, ever open to the dawning fullness of life, can be born again and stretch out into the future once more.
