What do the Readings say to us on this Sunday - The Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph?

First Reading (1 Sam 1:2--22, 24-28). Samuel was a very special child. Hannah saw him as a gift from God, a sign of God's favour to her. She dedicated him to the Lord. In due time Samuel made his own that dedication and went on to play a major role in the history of Israel. In truth, every child is a gift from God. All parents have hopes and dreams for their children, but parents can't determine the future for their children. The children must make their own choices.

Second Reading (1 Jn 3:1-2, 21-24). We are God's children and should live a life in keeping with this great dignity.

Gospel (Lk 2:41-52). This tells the story of how the twelve-year-old Jesus got lost in Jerusalem. It shows that misunderstandings can occur even in the best of families. We are inclined to say that "Jesus got lost in the Temple." Jesus did not get lost in the Temple. Rather, he was at home there. It was there he began to find himself, and to discover his true identity. He was not just the son of Mary, but the unique Son of God.

Joseph and Mary were entrusted with the raising of the child Jesus, who grew in wisdom and stature under their care. Today is an opportunity to honour the Holy Family and to be inspired by them.

The family unit is the foundation of any society and civilisation. If family life is strong, if the values that guide family life are strong, if they are values of love, generosity, peace, reconciliation, forgiveness, understanding, cooperation, self-sacrifice, self-control.... then this serves society and serves all humanity.

The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God - Saturday 1 January

Please note: A Special Mass will be celebrated in Holy Name Church on this day at 10:00am
